1. INTRODUCTION

Established at Ahmedabad in 1961, the National Institute of Design (NID) is a pioneering institute that offers multidisciplinary design education. The institute functions as an autonomous body under the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India and has been declared an Institute of National Importance by virtue of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 (No.18 of 2014) which has come into effect from September 16, 2014.


NID has attained national and international repute owing to its experience in the fields of design education, research, application of advanced teaching methodologies, and unparalleled design research projects all of which span more than six decades. It has been recognised as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (SIRO) by the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India. NID is also a member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).

From being a single-campus institute, NID has grown into a multicampus institute with a national and international profile. Presently, NID has two extension campuses—one each at Gandhinagar and Bengaluru which were established in the early 2000s.

From an institute mainly providing undergraduate programmes, NID has become one of the best design institutes in the world with graduate (B.Des.) and postgraduate (M.Des.) programmes across 5 broad faculty streams and 20 diverse design disciplines. In pursuit of its continued commitment to design research, NID started a Doctoral Programme in Design which gives impetus to design research priorities for its current faculty in collaboration with researchers who are selected as PhD scholars under faculty supervision.

The institute has state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities such as the Skill Development Labs, Knowledge Management Centre (KMC), Information Technology (IT) Centre, and Design Vision Centre to name a few. These have helped NID establish its leadership and preeminence among various design institutions.

NID continues to be an aspirational 'Institutional Global Brand' for the youth. This is manifested in the increasing demand to secure admission at NID. The number of students graduating from the institute each year has increased substantially; it has increased from 35 in 2000 to over 300 in 2020.





NID has also signed collaborative agreements with 100 premier design institutes across the world, facilitating increased international exposure for students and faculty. The institute's efforts towards becoming an effective medium for design promotion continue to draw strength from partnerships with other global organisations such as Cumulus, World Design Organisation (formerly ICSID), and GALA Consortium to name a few.

NID has been playing a significant role in promoting design through various first-time initiatives and has been instrumental in initiating the CII-NID Design Summit and the Businessworld-NID Design Excellence Award all with an aim to move towards a 'Designenabled India'.

NID's efforts towards making a National Design Policy finally materialised in February 2007 when the then Central Government announced the National Design Policy (NDP), the first among developing countries. In pursuance of the NDP, and with the initial handholding of NID Ahmedabad, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India set up four new NIDs for design education; namely, NID Andhra Pradesh, NID Haryana, NID Madhya Pradesh, and NID Assam all on the lines of NID Ahmedabad. As envisaged in the NDP, the Centre also set up the India Design Council (IDC) on March 2, 2009 with Director NID as its Member Secretary. NID's collaboration with several national and international institutions has helped foster a culture of scientific enquiry through collaborative partnerships; for the faculty and students, this has become a platform for exchanging knowledge and ideas.

NID is a unique institution with design excellence, intellectual wealth, and a time-tested educational culture that is instrumental in addressing social problems and concerns. Today, the institute's graduates are active in all sectors of the economy, and many have distinguished themselves in diverse fields such as textiles, product design, craft design and promotion, advertising, filmmaking, multimedia, automobile design, developmental communication as well as design education. The institute believes that good design is good business and that it contributes to economic prosperity and better quality of life.

1.1 NID'S EVOLVING MANDATE

NID's mandate is to offer world-class design education and promote design awareness and application towards improving the quality of life by or through the fulfilment of the following:

- Providing world-class design education to create
 design professionals of excellence who can help
 meet India's diverse design needs and create leaders
 in design education and research by recognising the
 changes in the economic and business environments
 in a global context.
- Encouraging the scaling up of quality design professionals and faculty through existing and new institutional mechanisms.
- Becoming a repository of design knowledge, experience, and information on products, systems, materials, design, and production processes related to traditional as well as modern technologies.
- Upgrading the design of products and systems of everyday use with an aim to bring in indigenous design solutions by focusing on affordable design for the masses.
- Undertaking fundamental and applied research to create cutting-edge knowledge in diverse areas of design and allied fields.

- Helping place designers in key sectors of national need for benchmarking of standards of design education and practice and encouraging them to 'think global and act local'.
- Offering integrated design consultancy services and providing opportunities to faculty and students to familiarise them with the practical applications of design knowledge while generating revenues simultaneously.
- Providing design inputs with the aim of using design as an integrating force in varied areas such as science, technology, and management. Also, improving the quality of life through well-designed products, services, processes, and systems.
- Humanising technology and integrating the physical with the virtual and digital worlds through better information and interface design by moving towards a holistic creative experience.
- Providing sustainable design interventions for crafts; handloom; rural technology; small, medium, and large-scale enterprises; and outreach programmes for capacity, capability, and institution building. All this would help create employment opportunities.





1.2 NOTEWORTHY EVENTS OF THE YEAR







Visitor's Conference 2020

Every year, the Hon'ble President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind hosts the Annual Visitor's Conference at the Rashtrapati Bhavan. This year too, National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad along with Heads of Central Universities/Institutes of Higher Learning in the fields of agriculture, pharmaceuticals, aviation, design, footwear design, fashion, petroleum and energy, maritime studies, planning and architecture, and information technology were invited.

This year, the conference was held online on September 19, 2020, and Praveen Nahar, the Director of NID Ahmedabad made a presentation on the activities and initiatives of the institute and implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

World Bamboo Day 2020 Webinar

NID hosted the 11th World Bamboo Day 2020-Bamboo Festival on September 18, 2020. Participants from more than 15 countries took part in the event which was organised by the India-Taiwan Global Tech Forum in association with South Asia Bamboo Foundation, National Institute of Design (NID) as main host, Assam Valley School (AVS), Kerala Forest Research Institute (KFRI), National Cheng Chung University (CCU) Taiwan, and Nagaland Bamboo Development Agency to name a few.

Shri Nitin Gadkari, Hon'ble Minister for Road Transport & Highways, Minister of Shipping and the Minister of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises delivered the inaugural speech at this event.

This year's key events were talks on Bamboo and related fields, honouring Bamboo Gurus from Southeast Asia, music bands from Vietnam, Indonesia, Taiwan, India (Kerala and Nagaland) which showcased the versatility of Bamboo, cooking shows with Bamboo shoots as main ingredient, innovations, and product, launching, comic strips and photography competitions for school children, and product design competitions for students and professionals were some of the key events for the WBD2020.

Online Jury at INDE Awards 2020

Praveen Nahar, the Director of NID Ahmedabad was invited to be one of the juries in the Inde Awards 2020 held online in April 2020. These awards recognise the contribution of a member of the architecture and design



community who has, throughout their professional life, shaped the design landscape of their country and influenced the design community at large.

On June 11, 2020, Praveen Nahar, the Director of NID Ahmedabad attended an online meeting with H.E. CII West Zone Principals Conclave on Technology for Future of Education

Praveen Nahar, the Director of NID Ahmedabad was invited to the panel discussion on 'Developing Teaching Skills for the Future'. It was hosted by the CII West Zone Principals Conclave on Technology for Future of Education on 27th June 2020. Today's world is being shaped by rapid technological change. Children and youth are likely to enter the job market or have careers that may be out of the realm of the experience of their parents and grandparents. Equipping children and youth for this brave new world will require teachers to have a



mix of skills that have always been the mark of a good teacher, alongside newer traits that will help pupils thrive in the 21st century. Teachers are required to have not only technical skills, but also communication skills which are important to be effective while mentoring the next generation. The session deliberated on the skills that teachers would need to build and develop in order to make teaching effective.

'Lines of Inquiry': A Digital Design Show

Encouraged by the positive feedback received during Convocation 2020, NID Ahmedabad started a web series comprising 15 episodes based on NID's Annual Design Show in form of graphical narratives. This was hosted online from August 17, 2020, onwards. The idea was to present the journey of dialogues that interrogate the purpose of design and creative practice.

Director, NID Ahmedabad Invited as Chief Guest



Praveen Nahar, the Director of NID Ahmedabad participated in an interactive meeting with the Research








RSD9 Conference Week

The 'Relating Systems Thinking and Design (RSD9) Symposium' was hosted by National Institute of Design (NID) Ahmedabad and Systemic Design Association from October 9–17, 2020. Originally, this symposium was scheduled to be held at NID Ahmedabad, however, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this year's edition was held online.

RSD started at the School of Architecture and Design (AHO) in Oslo, Norway, in 2012 with the intention to promote and foster emerging practices and theory development of systemic design for service systems, social systems, policy development, and complex contexts.

This year's theme was 'Systemic Design for Well-being: From Human to Humane', befitting lives as we are living them at this very moment. Being humane is marked by



compassion and empathy not only for humans, living beings, and our cultures but also our natural world and surroundings. RSD9 explored the connections between the well-being of our bodies, surroundings, and the planet.

The symposium had the following themes:

- Ecological and Circular Economies
- Flourishing Society
- · Health and Healthy Society
- Methodology, Philosophy and Theory of Systemic Design
- Design for Sustainable Ecology
- Co-design for Equity, Collectivism, and Citizens' Movements

RSD9 brought together 3 keynotes, 6 plenaries and about 50 presentations and group discussions on design outcomes and programmes informed by research, real applications, and practices to address problems in the unbounded complexity of social and ecological systems. It was attended by more than 400 delegates from 6 continents.

RSD9 also hosted a workshop series from October 9–17, 2020 along with an online exhibition of narrative posters and complex visualisations.

Resurgence: Designing for Now, Next and Future

Internet and Mobile Association of India (IAMAI), Design and Innovation committee, as one of its initiatives, organised the virtual Design Leadership Summit and Awards 2020 and the theme this year was 'Resurgence: Designing for Now, Next and Future'. On October 29, 2020, Praveen Nahar, the Director of NID Ahmedabad was invited to the panel discussion on 'Does Education Need Reinventing in the New Normal'.

Webinar on Design for Medical Devices by EEPC & NID

A webinar on 'Design Intervention for Medical Device Industry' was organized on November 6, 2020, in a collaboration for the 'Design' series between EEPC India and NID. The institute intended to help sensitise the industry to the necessity of including of the design applications for their products.

Swachhta Pakhwada Competition

Swachhta Pakhwada was initiated with a vision to mainstream the activities under the Swachh Bharat Mission across all Ministries/Departments of the Government of India.

With its focus on the COVID-19 pandemic, the competitions aimed at 'Behaviour Change Communication with a Low-Cost High Intensity Campaign' with the key messages highlighting the importance of wearing masks, following social distancing, and maintaining hand hygiene. These competitions were held for students, staff, and faculty in November 2020.

Grand Jury of the 6th CII Industrial IP Awards 2020

Praveen Nahar, the Director of NID Ahmedabad was invited to be a part of the Grand Jury for the 6th CII Industrial IP Awards 2020 held on December 15, 2020.

Inclusive Futures Through Handmade: Virtual Exhibition and E-Symposium

This was a virtual event curated from January 19–21, 2021 in response to NID's work in five craft clusters as Knowledge Partner for USTTAD, a scheme of the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India.

Visitors were able to experience a virtual tour of the curated exhibition showcasing design innovations in developing products, nuances of craft and design processes adapted for capacity building, and the upgradation of skills and knowledge. There were videos, product catalogues, and stories about the crafts persons to enhance the significance of the exhibition in totality.

A three-day E-Symposium was also organised on NID's insights, methods, and design tools adopted in implementing the scheme and dialogues with a range of famous experts from the crafts sector from all over India on subjects of skill training, sustainability issues, social inclusion, entrepreneurship, as well as craft-design collaborations.

Talk on 'Design Thinking and Innovation' at PRL Colloquium

6. DESIGN EDUCATION AT NID

6.2 PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

Professional Education Programmes at NID offers both Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) and Master of Design (M.Des.) programmes. The Bachelor's programme is of four-year duration for 10+2 school leavers level leading to the Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programme and the Master's programme is of a two-and-a-half-year duration leading to the Master of Design (M.Des.) programme.

The programmes at the institute operate through five main faculty streams with twenty diverse design disciplines:

Faculty of Industrial Design: Product Design, Furniture & Interior Design, Ceramic & Glass Design, Toy & Game Design, Transportation & Automobile Design, and Universal Design

Faculty of Textile, Apparel & Lifestyle Accessory

Design: Textile Design, Apparel Design, and Lifestyle

Accessory Design

Faculty of Communication Design: Graphic Design, Animation Film Design, Film & Video Communication, Exhibition Design, and Photography Design

Faculty of IT Integrated Design: New Media Design, Information Design, Interaction Design, and Digital Game Design

Faculty of Interdisciplinary Design Studies: Strategic Design Management, Design for Retail Experience, and a common interdisciplinary stream for undergraduate, postgraduate, and research programmes









6.3 ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES 2020-21

BACHELOR OF DESIGN (B.Des.)

The Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programme is offered in 8 disciplines covering 4 faculties. The programme spans four years (eight semesters) including a two-semester Foundation Programme. Despite being a generic design programme, it offers project-level specialisation in different areas of:

Industrial Design

Ceramic & Glass Design, Furniture & Interior Design, and Product Design

Communication Design

Animation Film Design, Exhibition Design, Film & Video Communication, and Graphic Design

Textile and Apparel Design

Textile Design

MASTER OF DESIGN (M.Des.)

Interactive areas of project-level specialisation are offered in 19 Master of Design (M.Des.) programmes:

Animation Film Design: classical animation, computer animation, model animation, and animation for the web.

Apparel Design: ready-to-wear range for women, costumes for film and theatre, work and protective wear, accessory design.

Ceramic & Glass Design: lifestyle products, studio pottery, and sanitaryware.

Design for Retail Experience: Designed for the candidates from various backgrounds, it looks at the retail industry in a holistic manner.

Digital Game Design: To train, nurture, and combine students' creative imagination with latest technologies to create games and experiences. The graduates of this programme will be highly required in the digital entertainment and computer gaming Industry.

Film & Video Communication: marketing communication (advertising and corporate films), social communication (developmental and educational short films), design for tourism industry.

Furniture & Interior Design: home furniture system,



office furniture system, retail furniture system.

Graphic Design: design for publications, marketing communications, social and developmental communications.

Information Design: A multidimensional programme that synchronises the fields of design, visual aesthetics, computer science, statistics, and humanities to inculcate a transdisciplinary proficiency into the future information design professionals.

Interaction Design: design and behaviour of various forms of digital products ranging from mobile phones, web-based to dynamic ones in gaming, education, transportation, healthcare, banking, retail and other domains.

Lifestyle Accessory Design: personal accessory products, products for living and workspaces.

New Media Design: web design, game design, interactive media, and software industry.

Photography Design: visual artists, photographers, cinematographers.

Product Design: consumer products (electronic and entertainment products, white goods), transportation,

capital equipment and machine tools, toys.

Strategic Design Management: strategic designers, design entrepreneurs, and design managers.

Textile Design: constructed textiles (woven, knitted, non-woven textiles), surface design print, mixed media, embroidery, finishing techniques (surface ornamentation), textiles for apparels, technical fabrics.

Toy & Game Design: educational and developmental toys, outdoor play equipment, soft toys, and multimedia games.

Transportation & Automobile Design: transportation and automotive sectors of the industry.

Universal Design: system-level design development of products adaptive for diverse users across cultures, social factors, transgenerational, physical, and cognitive abilities and inabilities.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (Ph.D.) IN DESIGN PROGRAMME.

This programme gives impetus to design research priorities for its current faculty in collaboration with researchers who are selected as Ph.D. scholars under faculty supervision.



6.4 EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

The institute is equipped with the Skill Development Lab, Innovation Lab, and specialised labs for Ceramics and Glass, Leather and Plastics; Textile and Apparel Design Studios, Computer Labs, GRIDS Studio, Online Education Centre, Knowledge Management Centre (housing approximately 63000 books and a large collection of journals, e-Books, e-Journals, audio-visual materials, and prototypes). It has a contemporary IT Centre and other well-equipped labs with about 1000 computers (in Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru campuses) including 700 high-end machines and software. The entire campus, including hostels,

is connected with Local Area Networking for both the internet and intranet facilities with around 1800 connections and Wi-Fi. The Design Vision Centre with Rapid Prototyping (RP) and High-Performance Visualisation (HPV) solutions are other significant facilities. Photography and printing studios, video and animation studios, and skilled technical staff assist design students in their learning process. All these studios are continuously upgraded and equipped to handle professional work and sponsored research in addition to meeting with the training needs of students.







6.5 K-PORTAL

A web-based information system was developed inhouse to facilitate faculty, students, and staff to come to a common platform and bring together content from various distributed resources and systems using information technology in an amalgamated form. It serves as a presentation service to the user, disseminating complete, accurate, and timely information available online. Its notable features are:

6.6 ADMISSIONS

The Admissions process undertaken by NID Ahmedabad, apart from admissions to NID Ahmedabad, currently also includes admissions to the four new NIDs that have been set up by DPIIT; namely, NID Haryana, NID Andhra Pradesh, NID Assam, and NID Madhya Pradesh.

Admissions 2020-2021

The final results for the admissions to the Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programme at NID/GDPD and M.Des programmes were declared online on July 23, 2020, and August 21, 2020 respectively.

In the B.Des. programme, 127 candidates (including 14 candidates in the Overseas category) were offered admissions for the Academic Year 2020-21.

In all, 300 candidates (including Overseas category) were offered admissions to the M.Des. programme for the Academic Year 2020-21 and the discipline-wise details of admitted candidates are as under:

No candidate was found suitable for admission to the PhD programme during Admissions 2020–21, as they did not meet the minimum qualifying criteria as mentioned on the Admissions website. Therefore, a second cycle for the PhD Admissions for the Academic Year 2020–21 was conducted. Due to the pandemic situation prevailing in the country, the DRT 1 & DRT 2 were combined and the interview was conducted in the Online mode.

In all, 44 applications (29 for part-time & 15 for full-time) had been received for the PhD Programme 2020-21 (second cycle). Out of the 44 applications, 6 (5 part-time and 1 full-time) candidates got shortlisted for admission to the PhD Programme in Design in the second cycle.

ADMISSIONS 2021–22

Advertisements were published in leading national dailies (English, Hindi and regional languages) in the January 2021 for Admissions 2021–22 to the B.Des, M.Des., and Ph.D. programmes.

Applicants to the M.Des (NID Ahmedabad) and B.Des (NID Ahmedabad, NID Andhra Pradesh, NID Assam, NID Haryana and NID Madhya Pradesh) programmes were required to apply online only on the official website of admissions http://admissions.nid.edu.

The Design Aptitude Test (DAT) (Prelims) for admissions to the B.Des. programme for the academic year 2021–22 was conducted at 33 test centres across 23 cities (Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Dehradun, Guwahati, Goa, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Kolkata, Kurukshetra, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur, New Delhi, Patna, Raipur, Ranchi, Shimla, Thiruvananthapuram and Vijayawada) in India on March 14, 2020.

The Design Aptitude Test (DAT) (Prelims) for admissions to the M.Des. programmes for the academic year 2021–22 were conducted at 17 test centres across 24

cities (Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Dehradun, Guwahati, Goa, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Kolkata, Kurukshetra, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur, New Delhi, Patna, Raipur, Ranchi, Shimla, Thiruvananthapuram and Vijayawada) in India on March 14, 2020.

In all, there were 11612 applications for the B.Des. programme. In all, 10751 candidates (including Overseas candidates) appeared in DAT Prelims exam for 144 seats (including 19 supernumerary seats in Overseas category) in B.Des.; 75 seats at NID Andhra Pradesh, 75 seats at NID Assam, 75 seats at NID Haryana and 75 seats at NID Madhya Pradesh (including 11 supernumerary seats in Overseas category). While the total number of applicants for the M.Des. programme across 19 disciplines was 4451, 4180 candidates (including Overseas candidates) appeared for a total of 399 seats in the M.Des. programme.

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic (second wave) and the uncertainties arising thereof, the date of the results of M.Des. and B.Des. DAT Prelims has not yet been announced.

6.7 PLACEMENTS


The Placement Office is a strategic platform to synergise and facilitate interaction between academia and industry with an aim to provide exposure to NID students, creating opportunities for students' project-based learning such as graduation projects, industrial training, classroom projects, and live projects. NID annually organises the Industry Interface through which the prospective employers and students can interact with each other, and the employers can identify suitable candidates for recruitment in their organisation. This event also creates awareness among the industries/firms/studios/NGOs/Govt. sector/MSMEs about NID and its various modes of operations.

Students are encouraged to pursue opportunities in areas such as social communication, service sectors, technology-enhanced learning, Craft Design, Green Design, Universal Design, and Experiential Design.

NID's Placement Office currently undertakes the following activities:

- Planning, organising and coordinating the annual Industry Interface at all three campuses.
- Coordinating between the industry/studios/NGO/ govt. sector and the students for industrial training, graduation projects, full-time placements, classroom projects, and lateral placements.
- Managing the online Students' Portfolio for the graduating batch and for students in their final semester.
- Coordinating industry visits and meetings with concerned HODs/coordinators and promoting industry presence in NID through lectures/ presentations and interactions/crosstalks for the students throughout the year.







- Facilitating queries of both students and industry.

1. Details of NID's online campus placements:


6.8 ALUMNI RELATIONS

6.10 EDUCATION AT NID: THE GLOBAL CONTEXT

NID has MoUs with 100 leading universities/institutions of repute overseas to strengthen collaborative academic relationships. This facilitates exchange programmes for students and faculty and encourages collaborative research activities through seminars and workshops. All this is done with the aim of placing Indian design perspectives in the global context. These exchange programmes enable both faculty and students to gain wider exposure and understanding about global design.

The COVID-19 pandemic had a noteworthy impact on the international activities of NID. Faculty visits abroad were either cancelled or postponed until further notice though they continued to participate online in various fora/discussions with international partners. The student exchange programme for foreign students at NID was suspended and the annual International Open Electives were postponed.

However, collaborative projects were initiated with international partners:

- Decentralising India's Digital Futures project, funded by the Scottish Funding Council, with the University of Dundee, UK along with Quicksand and the Mozilla Foundation, for conducting design research activities as follows:-
 - Research Consultancy on SDG (Sustainable Development Goals) implementation in India
 - o As a living lab and design space in our campuses

- Research-based graduation projects (students' project integration)
- Research specialism on the circular economy and systems thinking
- 'COVID-19 Impact to Unlock Potential for Textile Crafts in India' financed through the Global Challenges Research Fund COVID call in the UK, with the School of Textiles and Design, Heriot-Watt University, UK. The project aims to explore entrepreneurial opportunities for artisans in a socio-economic reality of disrupted supply chains and social distancing. It aims to co-create innovative interactions with heritage crafts that embrace the 'new normal' of COVID-19 and climate emergency, as formerly passive consumers find virtue in swapping product purchases for making and mending experiences.
- Through the Cultural Group of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in India, National Taiwan Craft Research and Development Center, and National Design Institute, Ahmedabad collaborated for the Taiwan-India Bamboo Crafts Online Exchange and Collaboration Project for bamboo craft design, technology and cultural inheritance, innovation and development, education of talents, and economic creation to promote the common development of craft culture and the growth of technological knowledge during 2020-21.

7. NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN: EXTENSION CAMPUSES

7.1 NID GANDHINAGAR CAMPUS

Considering new initiatives in education and the need for clearly focused research-led postgraduate programmes, an extension campus was developed at Gandhinagar in a 15-acre plot in July 2004. The first phase of the construction project covering the hostel block, faculty residence, and academic block was completed with procurement and installation of interior systems/LAN/WAN and the academic activities commenced from the new Academic Block from the Academic Year 2008–09. To start with, the postgraduate courses in Software and User Interface Design, Information and Digital Design, and New Media Design were conducted from the transit campus, Gandhinagar. With the completion of the first phase of construction (Academic Block and Living Spaces), four more postgraduate programmes; namely, Lifestyle Accessory Design, Apparel Design & Merchandising, Toy & Game Design, and Strategic Design Management from the Ahmedabad Campus were moved to the Gandhinagar Campus from the Academic Year 2008-09. With the completion of phase-II of the Academic Block, two more postgraduate programmes; namely, Photography Design and Transportation & Automobile Design were moved from the Ahmedabad Campus to the Gandhinagar Campus from the Academic Year 2011-12.

Highlights of the Year

- An online workshop titled 'Mask Project for Combating COVID-19' was organised with 16 M.Des. students from the 2018 and 2019 batches of Lifestyle Accessory Design. The workshop was held in collaboration with industry experts, medical garment manufacturers, and NID Faculty at the NID Gandhinagar Campus. The ten-day discussion-cum-exchange workshop focused on developing a mask. The faculty team led by Shimul Mehta Vyas, Principal Faculty; Lifestyle Accessory Design and Amresh Panigrahi, Senior Associate Faculty; Lifestyle Accessory Design were involved in conducting and mentoring the workshop. With the support of Rajeshree Jansari who worked on prototyping.
- A research paper titled 'Design for Small Businesses in India:Helping the Real Entrepreneurs' by Vipul Vinzuda, Jitendra Singh Rajput, and Amresh Panigrahi was presented at the Icord21 "Design for Tomorrow" IIT Bombay.
- Rishi Singhal from Photography Design along with Munem Wasif, photographer and teacher,



participated in an online panel discussion titled 'Keeping up with the Photograph'. The Guftgu Conversation Series, curated by Anshika Varma was facilitated and supported by Pro-Helvetia New Delhi's Now On Grant for the year 2020.

- Amarnath Praful from Photography Design was invited to speak at the Committee of Southern Asian Studies (COSAS), University of Chicago in February 2021. The presentation was on the cinema of Malayalam filmmaker Govindan Aravindan. The focus of COSAS, which is supported through a university endowment, is to support and implement faculty and student academic and research projects that broadly encompasses the study of south and southeast Asia.
- Rishi Singhal was invited to be part of the Academic Review Panel by Museum of Art and Photography, Bengaluru to advise on the Photography curriculum for the upcoming MAP Academy. The panel included Nathaniel Gaskell (Director MAP Academy), Suryanandini Narain (Prof. of Arts and Aesthetics, Jawaharlal Nehru University), and Rahaab Allana (Alkazi Foundation for the Arts). He was also invited to be part of a panel for the '10:10' session hosted by Photo Tool, Johannesburg on February 24, 2021. Supported by the African Culture Fund, '10:10' is an invitational session where 10 participants present their work and receive feedback from peers and invited respondents. The participants were photo artists working in Africa. Invited respondents in the

- panel were Rishi SInghal , Artist Thenjiwe Nkosi, and Photo Tool Director John Fleetwood.
- Rishi Singhal was the guest speaker in an online panel discussion 'The Arc of Time' conducted by Chennai Photo Biennale in collaboration with Jimi Arles 2019 and Alkazi Foundation for the Arts. He spoke on the topic of NID Archives and the relation between archival practices and contemporary works. The panel was moderated by Bhooma Padmanabhan and brought together Photography Design alumnus Arun Vijai Mathavan, curator Rahaab Allana, and photographer and artist Lukas Birk.
- Every year, there is a national toy festival in Iran
 where all the brands, companies, and those who
 are interested in the field of play and toys within
 the country participate. One of the major parts of
 this festival is the workshops and lectures about
 topics related to the world of toy design and toy
 production. The educational sessions are mainly
 attended by design students and researchers in the
 fields of psychology, education, design, production,
 and marketing.

Shekhar Bhattacharjee and Austin Davis, faculty members from the Toy & Game Design discipline were invited for an online session as part of the festival. They made presentations on the topics—'Toy Pedagogy at NID' and 'Problem Solving through Games'.





7.2 NID BENGALURU CAMPUS

NID's Bengaluru Campus addresses the long-felt need for a globally benchmarked centre for design research in the country by fostering creative design skills through NID's design acumen nurtured over more than five decades of intense teaching-learning processes. Situated in the research and development capital of India, Bengaluru, this campus focuses on high-tech design fusion and includes Digital Design, New Media/elearning, and design for manufacturing. NID's time-tested strength and experience in conducting research at the multidisciplinary level aspires to yield a new guild of "technology-design interface". The primary aim through such research is to create and share new knowledge in this fast growing and increasingly important field.



Highlights of the Year

- Neha Bharati (Universal Design), Shravani Agarkar (Information Design), and Nirmal Tandel (Design for Retail Experience) won the award for Scaling Empathy, a competition announced by Microsoft Design Expo 2019. Their project named 'COPE: Service Design' enables people to contribute effectively towards disaster victim's well-being and helps them recognise the impact of their contribution.
- Nikhil Das (Universal Design) was selected as one
 of the winners of the Government of Karnataka's
 Elevate Competition for his start-up. The recognition
 and funding of ₹ 30 lakhs was awarded to the
 'Dialysis Project' which aims to improve the quality
 of life of dialysis patients.
- Jitesh Chowdhury's (Information Design) project
 'A Devastated West Coast' which was a part of his
 Graduation Project that he was on with the team of
 Reuter's Graphics. He won the silver medal in the
 Society of News Design (SND) Awards. His other work
 at Reuters Graphics 'How the Novel Coronavirus
 has Evolved' has got global attention and a lot of
 appreciation in the media.



8. KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT CENTRE (KMC) AND NID ARCHIVES _____

Over the past six decades, the institute's Resource Centre (RC)/Knowledge Management Centre (KMC) has grown leaps and bounds with respect to the contents and the knowledge generated internally as a part of academics, consultancy, and research.

The mission of RC/KMC is to proactively facilitate resources for academic and design research endeavours of NID across Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru campuses.

KMC is considered to be the backbone of the institute and adopts a multifaceted approach towards managing print, digital, audio-visual material, and prototypes in a seamless manner. The collective strength of all resources at the KMC is aimed at giving the power to provide services under one roof, with online facilities to faculty members, students, researchers and corporate bodies and institutes associated with design.

Print Resources

KMC has a wide collection of books in its resources on design, science and technology, art and architecture, paintings, history, and humanities. Presently, the collection has approximately 73880 books and the periodical section has nearly 320 current subscriptions of journals with nearly 5682 back volumes at all three campuses. The rare and out-of-print collection includes archival collections on art, architecture, paintings, and history.


Document Collection

The document collection contains more than 7349 students' graduation projects, colloquium papers, craft documentations, and project reports at all three campuses. There are several other reports and documentations on various projects NID was involved in during the last 5 decades, which are unique with innovative themes and research-oriented studies.

Audiovisual Resources

The unique collection of audiovisual materials includes films, (audio cassettes, audio LP's, audio tapes, audio CD, digital audio tapes (DAT), films (16mm & 35 mm), filmstrips, microfilms and microfiche, slides (transparencies), video cassettes (U-matic, VHS, Betamax, Betacam), and video (CD and DVD). These contain NID's own works as well as the ones collected from other sources. These are mostly on the topics of design, film classics, and of course NID's own experimental and animation films. The audio collection contains hundreds of hours of music, both Indian as well as Western classical, Folk, Jazz, Pop and others. This collection also includes recordings of lectures and speeches held at NID, literature readings as well as sound effects, which are very important resources for both students and faculty in their design projects covering diverse themes and ideas.

The visual collection consisting of nearly 80,000 transparencies from the early 1960s till date is unique



in the area of Indian landscape, art, architecture and design, along with topics such as fairs and festivals, people, traditions, culture and others.


Digitization of KMC Resources

The KMC has digitized 3377 documents such as the colloquium papers, SLA documents, craft documents, diploma/graduation projects, and old influential magazines by NID's students during 1980s. These resources are preserved and made accessible online to NID community across the campuses. NID Ahmedabad is one of the partnering institutes with the NCAA project of the Ministry of Culture and implemented by IGNCA, New Delhi where NCAA had digitised 787 audiovisual materials of NID.

At KMC NID Ahmedabad Campus, the digital cataloguing and photography documentation work is in progress.

Prototype Collection

The collection is a display of furniture designs and other products from internationally renowned designers such as Charles Eames from the US, Le Corbusier from France, Marcel Breuer and Ludwig Mies Van Der Rohe from Germany, Poul Kjaerholm from Denmark, Bruno Mathsson from Sweden, Eero Saarinen from the US and Hans J Wegner from Denmark among others. This Classic Collection is displayed to encourage the study of design by inspiring budding designers with examples of highest standards. These were designed for the everyday life in Europe and America, and they emphasise the challenges the designers face with respect to new materials, new technologies, design processes, and aesthetics. Some of the designs are very artistic, truly classic, and captivating. The prototype collection of KMC is versatile with various designs of furniture, products, ceramics,



and kitchenware among others.

Conservation and Preservation at KMC Resources

KMC has started rectifying torn, damaged rare books for restoration and preservation. 399 rare books were preserved and conserved through INTACH, Lucknow in 2017.

The conservation is a continuous and long-term activity. So far, 26 craft documents and 43 diploma projects have been conserved and preserved in 2018 and three old influential magazines published by NID's students during 1980s have been digitised and conserved in 2019 through INTACH, Lucknow.

Resource Guides

KMC is providing resource guides to the faculty members from September 2019 onwards.

Resource guides are bibliographic details of books, audiovisual materials, and diploma/graduation projects falling into the respective courses that are scheduled in the academic timetable of B.Des. and M.Des. programmes across three campuses.

Soft Copies of Craft Documentations and Diploma/ Graduation Projects Provided to Students

During the pandemic, to support academics and research, on request of the students and the approval of the competent authority, KMC has provided soft copies of 209 diploma/graduation projects to 66 students and 12 faculty members and 70 craft documentations to 68 students and 2 faculty members.

Remote Login Credentials have been provided to 745 students, 68 faculty members, and 189 visiting faculty members.

Content pages of 18 Books and E-books have been provided to 8 students and 2 faculty members as per their request.




NID ARCHIVES

Introduction

NID Archives is the collection of materials including images, objects, prototypes, drawings, and other original documents. This collection is housed in the KMC and other departments and can be accessed for research and teaching purposes. NID Archives acquires and preserves materials of value specifically to institutional history and broadly to design history. Over the years, the KMC staff has provided support for students, faculty, and researchers from across the world who request access to the materials for their academic work. NID Archives contributes to knowledge production and to the dissemination of its collections within and beyond the institute. This has mostly been in the form of loan of archival materials for exhibitions and image licences for publication.

Vision

- To be a place for inquiry, inspiration, and research.
- To enrich people's lives by promoting research, knowledge, and enjoyment of the designed world.



Mission

- To collect, preserve, and provide access to records and artefacts, including photographs and publications that document the history and development of NID's programmes, policies, and procedures and contributions of individuals and organisations associated with it.
- To use the collections to advance creativity, critical thinking, and diversity of thought and practice, with an emphasis on supporting NID's curriculum and further the existing design discourse.
- To expand NIDs international reach, reputation, and impact.

Objectives

- The primary objective to establish the archives is due to its outstanding universal value as it is historically and artistically irreplaceable.
- Establish guidelines for accession and acquisition
 of materials of importance. Since archiving of
 both historical and current material is of primary
 importance in order to not to lose a huge part of the
 design heritage of South Asia.
- The main consideration for building an archive includes conservation as the physical condition of

- the historical materials is a big concern and there is a need for urgently implementing plans to safeguard the materials while setting up an archive.
- This includes conservation (as per the necessity and based on their condition) and digitisation of the negatives, positives, prints, drawings, posters, and audiovisual materials so that the digital images can be accessed and preserved for posterity. And the physical material can be conserved and stored in a secure place so that any further deterioration of the material may be halted.
- Explore and find ways to engage with the archives and contribute further to the existing design discourse.

Research & Publication

In the past few years, KMC/Archives has provided visuals, audiovisuals, and documents along with research support to a number of national and international scholars, researchers, artists, and students that have gone to be published and exhibited in various periodicals, journals, books, and shows.

Several students from Photography Design since 2015 have also worked in the design archives and have taken up those as graduation projects that have been a part of various shows and exhibitions.

NID Archives received its first grant from Wikimedia Foundation in February 2021 to conduct events under Art+Feminism Campaign to bridge the gender gap on information about and by women and other gender minorities involved in design, starting with NID and its history. It is an ongoing initiative.

Digital Archive Current Initiatives

To build the "Digital Archives" of NID Ahmedabad, Archives (KMC) has deployed AssetIndex+ Software from System Simulation, London. The software will support the cataloguing of various collections: negatives, images, audiovisual materials, craft documents, and diploma/graduation Projects. Currently, the software is being optimised for the use of the archives, while simultaneously cataloguing and marking all media objects physically. E-Commerce module to buy image access license is currently in the process of integration with the software.

Ongoing Work and Future Plans

NID Archives has been collaborating and volunteering with other archives networks and are going to take part in Milli consortium's events, where faculty members, staff, and alumni will be participating and presenting their work.

In July 2021, NID Archives will be launching its public programmes for the year 2021–22. The programme will have a series of talks, performances and lectures with a thematic focus once/twice a semester. This will help in garnering interest in the design archives for the NID community as well as for others. The programme would also have published material based on dialogues about Experiments in Art and Technology (E.A.T.), Bauhaus and more.

Also, the archives would be working towards developing exhibitions on various themes for different occasions such as the upcoming of the Diamond Jubilee of the institute.

9. RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

Design research is a proactive and exploratory way to develop design practice and education. The institute aims at creating a new body of knowledge on and through design research.

The institute conducts design research in the areas of Industrial Design, Communication Design, Textile and Apparel Design, Lifestyle Accessory Design, IT Integrated Design, and Design Management in domains related to industrial, social, and cultural concerns through basic and applied research, through experimental development and other activities.

NID's design research mandate also includes setting up of Design Research Chairs, which act as catalysts for collaborative research opportunities at NID. Chairholders or Fellows and their associated labs promote holistic design thinking backed by comprehensive research, culminating in futuristic visions, envisaging a better quality of life.

NID's research initiatives are fully integrated into its undergraduate and postgraduate curricula.

RAILWAY DESIGN CENTRE (RDC) Centre Head: Mohammed Naim Shaikh

National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad and Ministry of Railways (Railway Board), New Delhi signed an MoU on April 10, 2015. It aims at collaboration between NID and the Railway Board in all fields of design relevant to rail transport and allied activities, with a view to design, research, and develop innovative and the best design ideas and reinforce the best design practice in transportation design for the Indian Railways. This will be done with the participation of young designers, design service providers, design researchers, and design professionals and practitioners.

Focus Areas:

- Improvements in station ambience such as colour scheme of the station buildings, platform shelter, station name boards, signage and display boards
- Improvements in coaches including coach layouts, exterior and interior colour scheme, lighting and air-conditioning, signal and telecom, and passenger amenities
- Freight service systems and miscellaneous items such as design of improved working tools for track maintainers, light weight inspection trolley
- Environmental concerns and thrust areas and public relation issues
- Designing the Indian Railways logo, stamps/coins for special occasions, designing railway exhibition stalls
- Online services and other such developments which come under the scope of railways.

Ongoing Projects:

Materials & Composition, Lightweight & Sustainable Innovation

The study aims to find and refine applications of mycelium-based materials-composites and pure mycelium-to develop foam-like materials for use in railway seats. The objective of the study is to determine and develop the material potential of mycelium, its use in industrial manufacturing, and its desirability, feasibility, and usefulness as a viable

alternative to traditional, petrochemical-based non-biodegradable materials.

Status: Research and explorations through experiments in progress.

2. Seating, Interior and Exterior in the Context of Indian Railway Coach(es)

The project aims to design and develop a range of seating for different types of travel classes in Indian Railway Coach(es) considering the culture and values of Indian context. The seating arrangements and distribution may be different in terms of class, but it should be comfortable, convenient and safe for any passenger travelling by train. The seat materials may differ between the classes but should feel seamless considering its thickness, pattern, and styling. It must be durable and in parallel, require only minimal maintenance and repair.

Status: The project is in the prototyping stage.

3. Designing a System of Functional Uniform for the Indian Railway Crew Working on the Train

The project will be focused towards improving

functional as well as aesthetical and psychological aspects of the Indian Railway uniforms. It will include smart clothing concepts to improve efficiency and comfort of railway staff. The project will construct a motivational thought process in the design for better efficiency. The project will create the identity and legacy for Indian Railway's staff through the uniforms.

Status: Exploration and ideation in progress.

CENTRE FOR BAMBOO INITIATIVES (CFBI) Centre Head: C S Susanth

NID's Centre for Bamboo Initiatives (CFBI) has been set up at various campuses for activities related to Bamboo-based research, design, technical development, and training. This is a platform for faculty members, students and designers for innovation, experimentation, and building new resources for the bamboo sector in India and abroad. CFBI also supports entrepreneurs and connects various stakeholders for building up bamboo-based ecosystems to popularise its applications. The centre also participates in various events nationally and internationally to promote new developments taking place at NID for the advantage of the bamboo









sector. CFBI also organises international seminars and workshops and World Bamboo Day events at the NID Bengaluru campus for the promotion of bamboo as a sustainable material for day-to-day life. New product development, joints, finishes, introduction of new tools and equipment, and building curriculum and institutions are some of the major activities taken under by this centre.

Projects in Discussion:

Bamboo Product Innovation and Training for Artisans in Arunachal Pradesh

A discussion was held with Shri Himanshu Gupta IAS, Secretary, Dept. of Planning & Investment, Government of Arunachal Pradesh for an integrated approach to develop the bamboo sector in the state. Development in bamboo furniture, accessory, basketry, along with technical upgradation among others were focused upon.

Based on the discussion, a technical note has been sent to upgrade the production centres with new machines and equipment which they will be procuring before initiating the design workshops. An online workshop with selected clusters has been proposed to interact with artisans and give them an idea about potential possibilities in this cluster and to motivate them; it will be held during August 2020. It can also be a sample workshop to learn how to interact with artisans remotely to provide them online technical training with demonstration of actual product making.

NID Jorhat also can be a partner in this with NID Centre for Bamboo Initiatives to coordinate the field level activities. Further, Mr. Manu Prem, CM Fellow, Dept. of Planning & Investment, Government of Arunachal Pradesh is working towards organising an online interaction for artisans.

INTERNATIONAL CENTRE FOR INDIAN CRAFTS Centre Head: Amresh Panigrahi

India has the most significant craft tradition that continues to reflect diverse regional and socio-cultural profiles of our country. The sector has made remarkable contributions to the Indian economy. The tradition of craft practices in India continues to reflect the diverse regional and socio-cultural profiles of our country. It is an important part of our living material culture.

International Centre for Indian Crafts (ICIC) at NID is a set up with the primary aim to effectively understand the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats of a particular crafts sector in its local context. The centre applies NID's transdisciplinary design expertise and knowledge to bridge the gaps through a local-global approach. The unique approach is to develop a national and international network for crafts design research, training, and knowledge dissemination for providing collaborative and sustainable linkages to the Indian crafts sector.

 Experimental Project Initiated with NID's M.Des. Students: 'Beyond Matter', a system design experimentation with 16 M.Des. students of Lifestyle Accessory Design (LAD) 2018 was initiated to understand the service design opportunity and solutions for the Indian craft sector. The academic project aims to invite faculty colleagues to share their knowledge with NID students. Students are working under Amresh Panigrahi, Associate Senior Faculty, LAD in NID Gandhinagar.

The synthesis report has been published on the ICIC website. It is shared with the department, students, and faculty before considering their field visits to decide their priority research areas.

6. ICIC Resource Building

- Listing of design research papers written by NID faculty (current and past faculty) are available online (free access) platform. The links to all papers collected at one place as a resource shared with the student's community encourage design-led research writings.
- An exhaustive listing of crafts across India organised as a resource document titled '1000 of Indian Craft' shared with the student's community to encourage the study of Indian crafts and its spread across India.
- Webinars during COVID-19 lockdown by various organisations across India were collected as a resource shared with the NID students'

community in order to encourage them to think about Indian crafts, its challenges, and possible solutions through design research.

ICIC started promoting NID's work on crafts on the online platform. This initiative collaborated with various departments at NID and aimed to promote craft activity and research on a public platform to encourage students, mentors, and craft enthusiasts.

INNOVATION CENTRE FOR NATURAL FIBRE (ICNF) Centre Head: Amit Sinha

NID has set up an Innovation Centre for Natural Fibre (ICNF) at the NID Gandhinagar Campus with a focus on improvement in natural fibres processing techniques, capacity building in natural fibres development, and utilisation through innovation in design, engineering and technology.

ICNF focuses on the vision to create an innovation driven research culture in areas of sustainability, natural fibres and materials with the support of state-of-the-art infrastructure and efficient support services, enabling ICNF researchers to explore cutting-edge local, national,







and international research with respect for humanity, society and environment.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (IPR) CELL Centre Head: Bhavin Kothari

IPR Filing Process:

- Collected preliminary information from students for filing of IPR.
- Provided mentoring support to the students as per requirement.
- IPR Cell responded with technical advice to IDS on the objection received by the client for the trademark application of the 'Logistics India' logo designed by NID.
- Processing to reply to the first examination report with the Design Office for design registration of students' products.
- Reformulated IPR Policy by making certain timely amendments and modifications for the students.
- Filling of application and faculty recommendation are made entirely digital so that students can submit their details from anywhere.
- IPR Committee prepared guidelines for Commercialisation of IP created in classroom projects by students.
- IPR Cell applied for nine design registration digitally.
- The IPR Cell prepared the final revised design applications which are firstly to be submitted to the Registrar for endorsement and then to be couriered to the Patent Office, Kolkata.
- The IPR Cell drafted and prepared a revised database for the year 2017 and onwards, to be submitted to

- the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR) for availing excise duty exemption.
- Carrying out follow-ups with the applicants (students) on a continuous basis via emails and telephonic conversations, so as to file the counter reply to the FER.
- The cell satisfied and cleared the queries of the various stakeholders on a regular basis.
- The IPR Cell prepared the final revised design applications to the Patent Office, Kolkata for the Eight Design Registrations.

SMART HANDLOOMS INNOVATION CENTRE (SHIC) Centre Head: V Sakthivel

To take handlooms to the future, emerging paradigm for its cultural identity and sustainability and with an intent to integrate emerging technologies into creation of smart handlooms the SHIC has been set up with the support of Office of the Commissioner of Textile Development and Director of Handlooms and Textiles, Government of Karnataka for an initial duration of 5 years.

The purpose for the centre would be to integrate emerging technologies into creation of handlooms textiles. With an aim for seamless integration of traditional into the technological, this would lead to the creation of next generation of weavers. It also aims to extend continuous design support to the textile sector in the Karnataka State.

SHIC is a resource collaborative which brings together weavers and professionals from diverse fields of design, research, technology, marketing, and signs to make handloom weaving a sustainable livelihood and vibrant craft in Karnataka.













Project Status from April 2020-2021

- A website named 'Hasuhokku' (meaning 'interweave' in Kannada) was developed. The purpose of the website is to bring together weavers and professionals from diverse fields (of design, research, technology, marketing, business, and science) to restore the dignity of handlooms and its practitioners and to make handloom weaving a sustainable livelihood and vibrant craft in Karnataka.
- There was a composite exercise to create a distinct identity for handloom products from Karnataka by creating a brand value and specific market perception for the products. The Hasuhokku website strives to link weavers and the market space for informed consumers and buyers.
- A catalogue was also developed, and it offers a range of home furnishings and apparel products, designed in partnership with independent weavers and weavers' societies in the Bagalkote, Koppal, and Chitradurga districts of Karnataka.

2. TOSHIBA PROJECT ON RURAL HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTS

Project Head: Bibhudutta Baral

This project focuses on rural regions and areas which are situated adjacent to mega cities. Here, in this case, Bengaluru Rural has been the field of study. The research themes are air, water, food, energy and how problems in these areas affect and influence the

living environment, mental health and quality of life of rural people. How people deal with this situation? What are the indigenous and grassroots level solutions people develop? Can these be improvised by bringing technologies as modern support? Does it help to be near to mega cities for getting inspiration and suggestions for new kind of interventions to deal with rural problems? Each topic is a separate field of study. There will be four-five publishable papers at the end of the project. Each study will focus on the few aforementioned rural problems in detail, analyse the same, understand and explain what people do to the best of their knowledge and experience to deal with the problems and what kind of technology-based design interventions will solve problems in a more desirable way and thus improve the quality of life of people.

The project is almost on the verge of completion.

Three phases of data collection have been completed. The last phase work of; namely, that of writing the report/documentation and analysis of data is under progress.

3. NID FORD FOUNDATION GRANT

NID-Ford Foundation funding scheme was established a few years ago with an aim to promote and encourage socially responsive design. This scheme funds ideas/concepts which have the potential to enhance the quality of life in the Indian context. The guiding philosophy behind this funding scheme is 'Design for Development' covering important areas of design intervention such as social, economic, political, and cognitive domains, education and health. In the past, many students from various disciplines have benefitted from and availed of the grants from this scheme.

In 2020–21 and 2021–22, the grant shall support graduation projects/proposals focusing on UN Sustainable Development Goals in the context of COVID-19 which could cover a broad range of areas.

Twenty M.Des. students from the 2017 batch were selected for NIDFFG for 2020–21.

 Zoom meeting was arranged with 19 Young faculty








10. NID PRESS

11. CENTRE FOR TEACHING & LEARNING (CTL)_

Vision: CTL at NID Ahmedabad aims at supporting, promoting, and enhancing effectiveness, inclusivity, and equity in learning experiences and creating an institutional culture focused on learning by facilitating a space for sharing, discussion, and innovation of design pedagogy.

It functions under the office of the Activity Chairperson, Education and it operates across the three NID campuses – Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru. It facilitates activities under three distinct verticals: Explore, Reflect-Share-Critique, and Connect.

Explore, CTL holds lectures, workshops and training for faculty colleagues to inform them about new research in the domains of design pedagogy, cognition, and learnability.

Reflect-Share-Critique, CTL encourages in-house faculty to reflect on their teaching methods and share the same through various means. CTL also aids in coming together of cross disciplinary faculty across three NID campuses

to share, discuss and reflect on their teaching, by facilitating formation of Faculty Learning Groups (FLG) / Subject Interest Groups (SIG).

Connect, CTL aims to partner with departments within the three NID campuses, alternative education hubs & think tanks, with international MoU partners; to share, learn and contribute towards a robust "design learning and teaching culture". CTL facilitates formation of COPs-Communities of Practice, across the International MoU partners. COPs are a group of people who come together to share ideas or concerns and determine solutions.

Activities of the CTL

Developed and Submitted a Detailed Proposal on Approach and Logistics to Establish a Design Education Research Lab and a Curriculum for a Programme on Design Education

The CTL team has developed and submitted a detailed proposal to NID to establish a Design Education Lab, research activity in design education, and a new programme on design education. The proposal also maps scope for funding support.

Research on design education has been an underexplored area in India and provides a potential to initiate research, experiments, and innovation-led programmes for the future. This needs to be supported to improve the quality of educational experiences through the education and training of design educators across the country. It aims to further wide dissemination through training, workshops and publications. The growth and popularity of design education in India is growing rapidly and thus intensifying this need.





Through CTL, the institute intends to initiate, encourage and undertake training modules for orientation of young Design Educators and upgradation of mid-level and senior design educators across the country. existing faculty upgradation. CTL has proposed research driven scholarly activities in the area of design education which demand collaborative approach and support by the government, industry, and research bodies to widen the scope for educators – socially and globally. The outcome of the proposal intends to utilise research into shaping a newly proposed Master's programme in Design Teaching and Training.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

The COVID-19 pandemic severely affected the decisions pertaining to educational activities at NID. The students had to go back home. The faculty were left with no choice but to navigate to the online mode in order to conclude ongoing classes. Fully online teaching was undertaken over a duration of about 3 months-March 2020 till June 2020. To gain insights into `emerging' pedagogy of online teaching-learning, adopted by NID faculty, in response to the sudden lockdown crisis brought in by the pandemic, a series of activities were undertaken.

- Blogsite (June 2020): CTL initiated a blogsite 'digitalctl.wordpress.com', with three posts on post-Covid shifts in design teaching- learning, design practice and in larger socio-economic paradigms. The intention was to share a platform where faculty colleagues could come and share comments, links, their stories and thereby remain connected, despite the distancing enforced by lockdown.
- 2. Short Study (April-July 2020): A short study began in March and the final outcomes were shared in July 2020. The aim of the study was to gain insights into 'emerging' pedagogy of online teaching-learning, adopted by NID faculty, in response to the sudden lockdown crisis brought in by the pandemic. The intention was to get colleagues to share, reflect, understand and be inspired by the ways and means through which all attempted to deliver the desired inputs, challenges faced and how we overcame the various restrictions and limitations. Finally, these

efforts are envisaged to help faculty to find more effective ways of maintaining quality associated with NID's pedagogy rooted in the 'Learning by Doing' philosophy and ensure continuity of the education process.

The CTL team decided to listen to stories of colleagues about their teaching-learning experiences. In order to ensure that the sharing is more relevant, smaller groups of faculty members of allied disciplines were created. Representative faculty colleagues from each department were then invited for an online sharing meeting. There were 6 such groups created, across the 3 campus and of 19 design disciplines.

Faculty members were asked to share in brief: 1) process of conducting the Design Project online, 2) the challenges, 3) what worked/new insights. The sharing itself has been a reassuring and a learning experience. The findings were compiled in a comprehensive 54-page report which was shared in pdf format in a report titled 'Towards Blended Hybrid Teaching/ Learning'.

- 3. Online Teaching Survey (August 2020): After the new semester commenced in remote learning mode, a short survey was conducted by the CTL team, to understand the various modes and means of online teaching vis-à-vis ease of platforms, new norms of attendance, duration of inputs and others. The outcome was shared with all colleagues during the semester's Faculty Forum. This gave insights to the patterns of use of the various digital platforms and tools for online education.
- 4. Online Teaching-Planning Tool (September 2020): A digital tool to plan for the online course preparation was conceived by the CTL team and shared with all faculty colleagues. The purpose was to help them with backward plans and ensure the readiness for the online mode of courses. This allowed a comprehensive format for planning details such as getting scans of books/ download reading material/ record videos of processes and plan kits for materials to be couriered.

12. INTEGRATED DESIGN SERVICES (IDS)

Client servicing is integral to NID. Through the Integrated Design Services (IDS) NID undertakes consultancy projects from various government, semi-government, and private organisations and professionally deliver design solutions in diverse design domains ranging from Industrial Design, Communication Design, Textile/Apparel/Lifestyle Accessory Design and IT Integrated Design.

IDS also has its Outreach Activities to provide the institute's experience and training facilities to the services of craft sectors in the areas of training, research and need assessment study, craft documentation, capacity building and skill upgradation in design using contextual approach.

Through its 'Earn While You Learn' scheme, IDS also facilitates students to work on actual projects, which in turn, adds value to the upcoming design professionals giving them an awareness about the real situations.

Over the last 50 years, NID has successfully completed many projects of national importance which includes logo design for more than 500 government, semigovernment, and private organisations.



Over the last two decades, the institute has significantly expanded its educational programmes and student intake, built two new campuses, and considerably expanded its activities beyond education. - Provide policy related inputs on all the above matters to the institute's Senate, Standing Committee, and Governing Council.

18. OFFICIAL LANGUAGE IMPLEMENTATION

In order to ensure adequate propagation and development of the Official Language (OL-) Hindi as per the Official Language Policy of the Government, the institute holds various activities/programmes in Hindi during 2019-2020 in the perspective of Annual Programme for 2019–2020 issued by the Department of Official Language. In order to comply with the instructions issued by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry regarding implementation/compliance of OL Policy of the Government and to achieve the target fixed by the Department of Official Language, with a renewed focus on the deliverables that must be sustained throughout the plan, not solely at its inception. The report also highlighted the importance of interdepartmental coordination in implementing an official languages plan.

The Official Languages Coordination Unit has been tasked with coordinating departmental action plans and with providing support needed by departments to identify and achieve the strategic. The institute has drawn its own action plan to implement various provisions contained therein. The OL Section mandate is therefore to ensure continued progress as the plan is rolled out and implemented in the coming years. Ministry-wise/Region-wise assessment of the use of Hindi, on basis of review of the compliance of the section 3(3) of the Official Languages Act, 1963 and rule 5 of the Official Languages Rules, 1976 relating to correspondence in Hindi, publication, code-manual and training etc. in Hindi, purchase of Hindi books in Central Government Offices, computerization and Hindi, compulsory provision of Hindi knowledge in recruitment rules, availability of Hindi medium in academic and training institutions, expenditure on Hindi advertisements and use of Hindi for commercial activities etc.

As a first step in this regard, most of the correspondences with Central and State Government organisations were made in Hindi. Apart from the day-to-day official works in Hindi, the following Hindi activities were organized in the institute with utmost motivation and encouragement.

Celebration of Bhasha Utsav-2020

With a view to create consciousness and accelerating

the use of Hindi as an Official Language, a Bhasha Utsav, was organised by this department in September 2020. Several competitions are organised every year during the Bhasha Utsav in three campuses—Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar and Bengaluru and this year too, events such as, Hindi Kavita Pathan, T-Shirt & Poster design, Hindi Geet - Gayan, Hindi Cartoon & Comics and Hindi Storytelling were organised for the students, faculty members, and staff. At the end of the event, prizes were distributed to the winners though this year all programmes were held online due to the pandemic.

Publications in Hindi

The Hindi translation of institute's Annual Report for the year 2019–2020 has been published and like each year, were laid on the tables of both the Houses of Parliament.

Official Language Manual, calendars, films, posters, etc., are also brought out to give information regarding the activities relating to propagation and progressive use of Hindi as the Official Language.

Hindi magazine, Rupankan dedicated for encouraging writings in the field of Official Language, literature, technology, information technology, etc. and also to give wide publicity to the efforts being made in different Central Government Offices for the use and propagation of Official Language Hindi. Its 6th edition was published last year wherein articles in Hindi were contributed by the students, employees and faculty members of the Institute. Few articles contributed by the guest authors were also included in the magazine. Hindi, Films, Posters, etc., are also brought out to give information regarding the activities relating to propagation and progressive use of Hindi as the Official Language.

Official Language Implementation Committee (Rajbhasha Karyanvayan Samiti):

During the year 2020, a new committee was formed in November 2020.

The institute regularly takes part in various activities organized by TOLIC Ahmedabad. Participation in various activities was ensured by the Director NID. Senior Administrative Officer, Officer-in-Charge Hindi Cell and Superintendent, OL attended the meeting of TOLIC Ahmedabad.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN, AHMEDABAD ("the Institution"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2021 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the financial statements").

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Annual Accounts of National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad for the year ended 31st March 2021.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad as on 31 March, 2021 and the Income & Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 25(2) of the National Institute of Design (NID) Act, 2014. These financial statements are the responsibility of the NID's Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial statements with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii. The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Government under sub-rule (1) of rule 4 of National Institute of Design (Form of Annual Accounts) Rules, 2016.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the NID as required under Section 25 (1) of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv. We further report that :

Comments on Accounts

A. Balance Sheet:

A.1 Current liabilities (Schedule 5): Rs. 37.09 cr.

A.1.1 for Advance for Projects in Progress: Rs. 18.47 cr.

The above include Advances received against various Integrated Design Services Projects (IDS) valuing to Rs.1.45 crore (22 projects) which have already been completed as on 31 March 2021. Thus, non-adjustment of the advances against the completed projects in the accounts has resulted into overstatement of Current Liability, understatement of income and consequent understatement of surplus by Rs.1.45 crore.

A.2 Current Assets, Loans, Advances Etc. (Schedule 8): 113.44 crore

A.2.1 Income Accrued: Rs. 3.64 crore

The above includes Rs. 3.56 crore being amount of other project receipts and Rs. 0.07 crore service charges which are lying outstanding for more than one year. Despite being pointed out in SARs for the year 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20, Institute had neither recovered these old receivable nor have any policy of provision for the doubtful recovery in the accounts for the financial year 2020-21. Non provision has resulted in overstatement of Current Assets, Loans and Advances and Surplus carried over to Balance Sheet by Rs. 3.63 crore.

B. Income and Expenditure Account

B.1 Establishment Expenditure (Schedule 14): Rs.44.47 crore

The Discontinuance Liability towards Privilege Leave Liability as per Actuarial Valuation has been worked out to Rs.20.41 crore as on 31st March 2021. However, no Earmarked Fund for leave encashment has been created. This has resulted in understatement of Liability (Earmarked Fund), understatement of Establishment Expenditure and consequent overstatement of Surplus by Rs.20.41 crore.

C. General

As per records made available, certain legal and arbitration cases are pending against the Institute which included cases of higher pay scale demand pending in Central Administrative Tribunal, Difference in wage under Minimum Wages Act pending in Regional Labour Commissioner (Central) Labour Court etc. These cases may occur financial liabilities in future. However, neither any disclosure nor any notes forming part of Accounts in this regard is provided in the Books of Accounts for the year 2020-21. This should have been suitably disclosed with an estimate of its future liability and financial impact in accounts

D. Grant-in-aid

NID had unspent balance of Plan Grant of Rs. 27.16 crore pertaining to previous years. The Government of India has given Plan Grant of Rs. 41.72 crore (including Interest on Grant Rs. 0.80 crore) to NID during 2020-21. Out of the total grant of Rs. 68.88 crore, Rs. 44.21 crore has been utilized in the current year leaving a balance of Rs. 24.67 crore unutilized as on 31 March 2021.

E. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Separate Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Chairman, NID through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v. Subject to our observation in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to matters mentioned in the Annexure-I to this Separate Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India, except the following:
 - a) in so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad as at 31 March 2021; and
 - b) in so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, of the excess of income over expenditure for the year ended on that date.

ANNEXURE 2

INDIA DESIGN COUNCIL

The India Design Council is an autonomous body of the Government of India established under the aegis of Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion, Ministry of Commerce and Industry. It is a national strategic body for multidisciplinary design and is involved in design promotion and ultimately make India a design-enabled country. In 2007, India became one of the few countries to adopt a National Design Policy. To enable the policy implementation, the Indian Government announced establishment of the Indian Design Council (IDC) in March 2009.

The India Design Council is spearheading the national design direction and is working with other government agencies, the design community, industrial establishments, and educational institutions to promote design in business, and society and public services so as to develop design excellence.

The India Design Mark is a design standard or a symbol which recognises good design. The India Design Council grants the India Design Mark after evaluating good design through a systemised process. India Design Mark is initiated in cooperation with the Good Design Award, Japan. The India Design Mark symbolises product excellence in form, function, quality, safety, sustainability and innovation and communicates that the product is usable, durable, aesthetically appealing and incorporates the value of social responsibility.

The third council formed on May 8, 2017 completed its three-year term on May 7, 2020. The reconstitution of the next Governing Council of the IDC by the Ministry is awaited.

Virtual Jury of I-Mark 2020: On September 19, 2020, the IDC organised the final second stage jury of I-Mark 2020; it was the ninth cycle of the India Design Mark. The originally scheduled I-Mark 2020 Jury & Exhibition in March 2020 was called off due to the prevailing COVID-19 pandemic.

The Member Secretary chaired the jury alongwith the team of 13 jury members who conducted the online jury for 62 entries in the virtual presence of the applicants.
