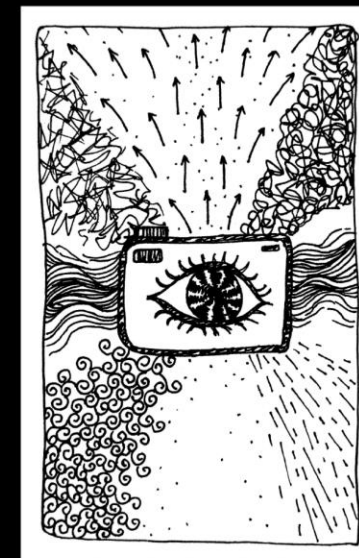

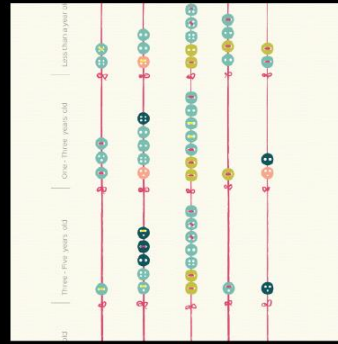
Data Viz as a medium of self expression

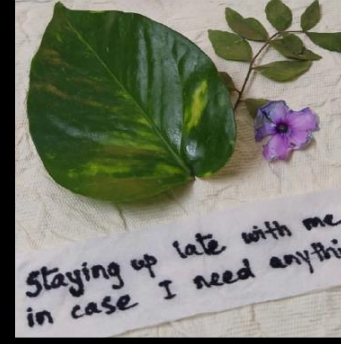

CREATING TANGIBLE TEXTILE SURFACES

The pandemic has forced us to miss many experiences which were a norm in our lives earlier.. In this workshop we bring closer to us these intangible experiences which we missed the most, be it a person, memory, a visual, a feeling, sounds, smell or a touch by making a tangible deliverable. This simulated personal perspective which when seen, experienced or touched, recollect these missed sensory experiences. We have built a library of visual or tactile references using textile techniques. The objective would be to simulate a sensory response and associate that emotional response with the favored experience. We try to connect the physical distance with a sensory experience. The pandemic has also taught us the importance of what is required. . We focus on these items which we learn to reuse, recycle and up cycle. Techniques explored: embroidery, tie dye, fabric manipulation, printing.

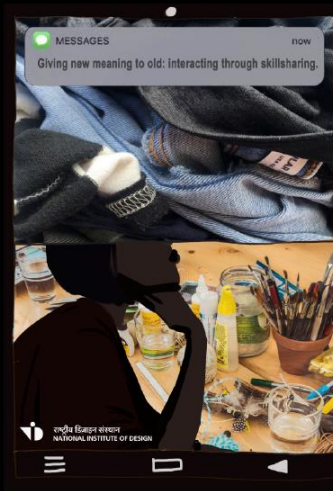
((Makeflix invites people to connect with themselves, their surrounding and community; and the environment through waste repurposing and repair.))

## MYTH MAKING IN THE AGE OF FAKE NEWS

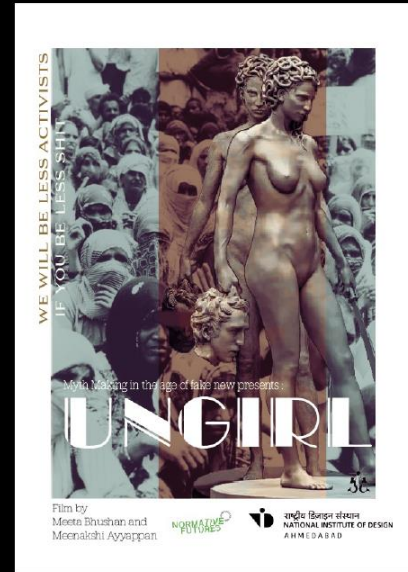

**Physical + Digital rituals**

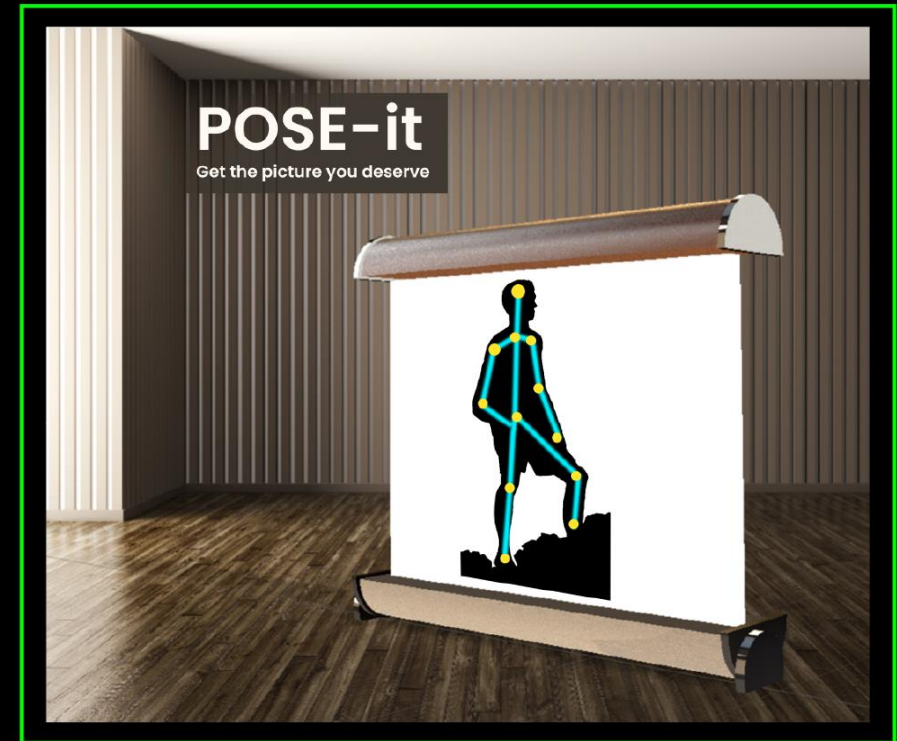

The starting point for the "Physical+Digital rituals" workshop was to reflect on what are those positive rituals that make us happy, and how they might change in the future. Our goal was to redesign these rituals, trying to maintain the same positive elements that make up the original experience. To do this, we applied a Positive Design approach, using some specific tools and templates that let students deepen the psychological needs behind three positive rituals of their choice. 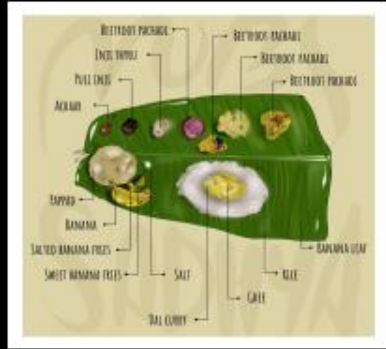

The Workshop was a practical experiment to see the possibility of change in lived lives through personal modification of thought, deeds and outreach to the immediate community. In order to prepare for global Normative Futures. The Virus caught us unprepared yet the lockdown nurtured skills, behaviour, mental perspectives and global network of connectivity for learning as well as entertainment. A hundred years ago, to prepare for unseen future of free India, Gandhiji's unique yet simple Ashram Life Lab experiment attempted to create a new Core Community of caring individuals. A similar lab of globally wired young citizens tethered to local milieu, could be attempted for a Normative Future

To Rethink and Re Imagine our definition of life essentials and to prepare individuals to become nucleus for social transformation. To be aware of the nitty gritty details of our local community, produce, supply and sources. Through various assignments that would make them think, the students could become more aware and explore their own values, relationships and environment. Daily exercise class assignments extrapolated into offline field work to inculcate desired objectives. There were Guest Talks by Ela Bhatt and Kaori Kurihara for practical insights. With each individual as a nucleus, the concentric circles spread out to serve, help, sustain and nourish others. A lot of introspection and deep thinking was triggered during the workshop but would hopefully continue to simmer in their subconscious.

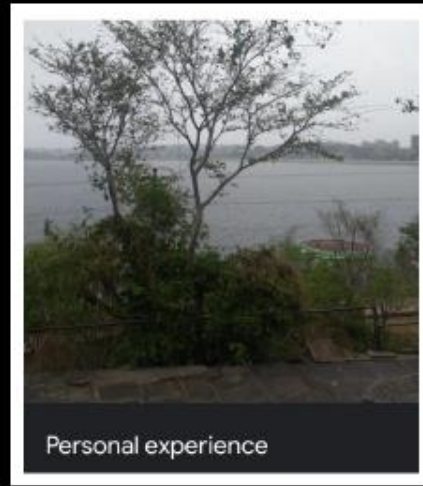

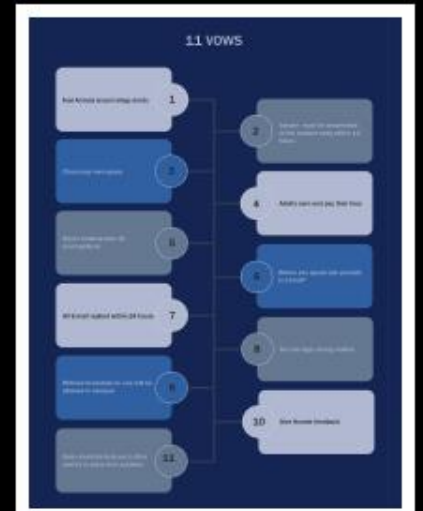

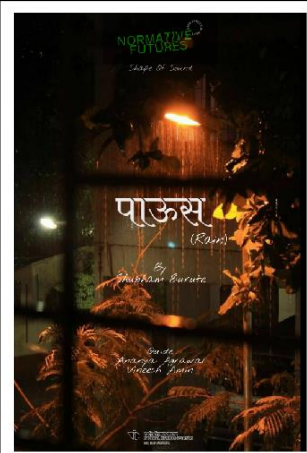
## Shapes of Sound

# The Ascetic Designer

The course was an experimental effort at probing the use of a self-reflective process in a situational event, in our case the Covid 19 lockdown. The hope was to use our personal experiences as a source to resolve the forced limitations of the moment.

# Vulnerable Machines

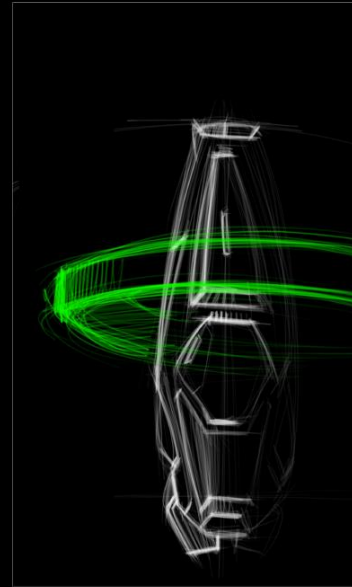
Rethink and redesign the human - robot interaction
