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1. INTRODUCTION

Established at Ahmedabad in 1961, the National Institute of Design (NID) offers multidisciplinary design education. The institute functions as an autonomous body under the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India and has been declared an **Institute of National Importance** by virtue of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 (No.18 of 2014) which has come into effect from September 16, 2014.

NID has attained national and international repute owing to its experience in the fields of design education, research, application of advanced teaching methodologies, and unparalleled design research projects all of which span more than six decades. It has been recognised as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (SIRO) by the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India. NID is also a member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).

Beginning as a single-campus institute, NID has now grown into a multicampus institute with a national and international profile. Presently, NID has two extension campuses—one each at Gandhinagar and Bengaluru which were established in the early 2000s.

From an institute mainly providing undergraduate programmes, NID has become one of the pioneering design institutes in the world with Bachelor's (B.Des.) and Master's (M.Des.) programmes across 5 broad faculty streams and 20 diverse design disciplines. In pursuit of its continued commitment to design research, NID started a Doctoral Programme in Design which gives impetus to design research priorities for its current faculty in collaboration with researchers who are selected as Ph.D. scholars under faculty supervision.

The institute has state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities such as the Skill Development Labs, Knowledge Management Centre (KMC), Information Technology (IT) Centre, and Design Vision Centre to name a few. These have helped NID establish its leadership and pre-eminence among various design institutions.

NID continues to be an aspirational 'Institutional Global Brand' for the youth. This is manifested in the increasing demand to secure admission at NID. The number of students graduating from the institute each year has increased substantially; it has increased from 35 in 2000 to over 300 in 2021.

NID has also signed collaborative agreements with 100 premier design institutes across the world, facilitating increased international exposure for students and faculty. The institute's efforts towards becoming an effective medium for design promotion continue to draw strength from partnerships with other global organisations such as Cumulus, World Design Organisation (formerly ICSID), and GALA Consortium to name a few.





NID has been playing a significant role in promoting design through various first-time initiatives and has been instrumental in initiating the CII-NID Design Summit and the Businessworld-NID Design Excellence Award all with an aim to move towards a 'Designenabled India'.

NID's efforts towards making a National Design Policy finally materialised in February 2007 when the then Central Government announced the National Design Policy (NDP), the first among developing countries. In pursuance of the NDP, and with the initial handholding of NID Ahmedabad, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India set up four new NIDs for design education; namely, NID Andhra Pradesh, NID Haryana, NID Madhya Pradesh, and NID Assam all on the lines of NID Ahmedabad. As envisaged in the NDP, the Centre also set up the India Design Council (IDC) on March 2, 2009 with Director NID as its Member Secretary. NID's collaboration with several national and international institutions has helped foster a culture of scientific enquiry through collaborative partnerships; for the faculty and students, this has become a platform for exchanging knowledge and ideas.

NID is a unique institution with design excellence, intellectual wealth, and a time-tested educational culture that is instrumental in addressing social problems and concerns. Today, the institute's graduates are active in all sectors of the economy, and many have distinguished themselves in diverse fields such as textiles, product design, craft design and promotion, advertising, filmmaking, multimedia, automobile design, developmental communication as well as design education. The institute believes that good design is good business and that it contributes to economic prosperity and better quality of life.

1.1 NID'S EVOLVING MANDATE

NID's mandate is to offer world-class design education and promote design awareness and application towards improving the quality of life by or through the fulfilment of the following:



- Helping place designers in key sectors of national need for benchmarking of standards of design education and practice and encouraging them to 'think global and act local'.
- Offering integrated design consultancy services and providing opportunities to faculty and students to familiarise them with the practical applications of design knowledge while generating revenues simultaneously.
- Providing design inputs with the aim of using design as an integrating force in varied areas such as science, technology, and management. Also, improving the quality of life through well-designed products, services, processes, and systems.
- Humanising technology and integrating the physical with the virtual and digital worlds through better information and interface design by moving towards a holistic creative experience.
- Providing sustainable design interventions for crafts; handloom; rural technology; small, medium, and large-scale enterprises; and outreach programmes for capacity, capability, and institution building. All this would help create employment opportunities.





1.2 NOTEWORTHY EVENTS OF THE YEAR



 MoU with Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts, New Delhi

On July 22, 2021, NID Ahmedabad signed a Memorandum of Understanding, with Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA), New Delhi, to explore avenues for faculty research, collaborative projects, student programmes at IGNCA, access to IGNCA library and archival resources, collaboration in conferences, workshops, exhibitions, and festivals, development of digital resources and other areas of common interest. **Praveen Nahar**, Director NID Ahmedabad represented NID while **Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi**, Member Secretary, IGNCA New Delhi signed this MoU on behalf of IGNCA.

• Exhibition 'With[out]'

With[out], an exhibition about absences overlooked and usually disregarded, that attempt to question us about our urban routines, choices, decisions, and everything in between was organised from August 10–13, 2021. 75th Independence Day

The 75th Independence Day was celebrated at the Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru Campuses on August 15, 2021. **Praveen Nahar**, Director NID addressed the NID community on this day. A cultural function too was arranged with the



participation of students, staff, faculty, and their families who were present adhering to COVID-19 norms on the day. A tree plantation drive was organised as a part of creating better green cover within the campuses.

• Workshop by François Serre

François Serre, the Director of Courant 3D, which is the annual Festival of Immersion and Interactivity in Angouleme, France conducted a workshop for students and faculty of NID on November 25, 2021. Serre is also the "New technologies / New storytelling" curator for different festivals (the Clermont Ferrand International Short Film Festival, the Berlin International Film Festival, among others). He specialises in and teaches new media and short and documentary films. This workshop was conducted at NID's Ahmedabad and Gandhinagar Campuses.

• FURNICULTURE and STIMULUS

Students of Furniture & Interior Design (FID) discipline, both B.Des. & M.Des. batches, organised

"FURNICULTURE" and "STIMULUS" from December 20–31, 2021 at the NID Ahmedabad Campus:

Students from the B.Des. 2019 batch exhibited and presented their work in the exhibition titled 'Furniculture' at the NID Ahmedabad Campus. This exhibition was an outcome of an 8-week long Design Project course. The theme for this project was Indian Culture. Students hail from diverse regions across India and thus one could see a variety of furniture looking different yet having a common feel of 'Indianness' in all of them.

'Stimulus' was an exhibition by students of the M.Des. 2021 batch. It displayed the process and outcomes of a 4 week-long Materials & Properties course; this is skill-based course and is the first discipline-oriented course for the incoming master's batch. The core goal of the course was to familiarise students with construction materials for furniture and their usage in a structure. This time, the final group assignment was to design a structure that is under the size of 3'x3'x3'using a minimum of five materials: wood, metal, plastic, bamboo, and flat board. The idea behind this assignment was to motivate students to work with multimaterial structures and prepare them to handle detailing and joineries in such big structures with considerable dead load.

• 73rd Republic Day

The 73rd Republic Day was celebrated at NID Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru Campuses on Jan 26, 2022. On this occasion Praveen Nahar, Director NID unfurled the Indian tricolour and addressed the NID community. Due to the pandemic situation, cultural programmes and other events such as tree plantation were not celebrated.

• Bonjour India Festival 2022

The 4th Bonjour India Festival is celebrating 75 years of Indian Independence along with 75 years of Indo-French diplomatic relations, and the Embassy of France in India, through its culturaleducational network in India organised over 100 presentations across 19 Indian cities from March through May.

The festival was officially inaugurated on March 29, 2022 at the Residence of France in New Delhi in the presence of **Smt. Meenakshi Lekhi, Hon'ble Minister of State for External Affairs and Culture** and the Director of NID Ahmedabad **Praveen Nahar** and **Shilpi Munda**, Associate Faculty, Graphic Design were invited to this inauguration.

Celebrating Indo-French diplomatic relations, **Shilpi Munda**, designed the logo for the 4th edition of the Bonjour India festival. The logo retained the essence of the festival that was central to fostering human exchanges between the two countries through arts, culture, science, and education.






6. DESIGN EDUCATION AT NID

6.1 LEARNING TO LEARN, LEARNING TO KNOW, AND LEARNING TO DO

A multidisciplinary and multicampus institution recognised for its design excellence and thorough understanding of design capabilities, NID is acknowledged as a premier design institute contributing to the design profession and encouraging economic and holistic growth through leadership in education, research, and design service to the society.

NID's successful evolution can be attributed to a core set of institutional capabilities and values that inspire its vision and to the dedication and achievements of its faculty, students, staff, and alumni. Over the years, NID has restated its mandate and sharpened its vision while retaining its core values and building on its fundamental strengths.

6.2 PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

Professional Education Programmes at NID comprises both Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) and Master of Design (M.Des.) programmes. The Bachelor's programme is of four-year duration for 10+2 school leavers-level leading to the Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programme and the Master's programme is of a two-and-a-half- year duration leading to the Master of Design (M.Des.) programme.

The programmes at the institute operate through five main faculty streams with twenty diverse design disciplines:

Faculty of Industrial Design: Product Design, Furniture & Interior Design, Ceramic & Glass Design, Toy & Game Design, Transportation & Automobile Design, and Universal Design

Faculty of Textile, Apparel & Lifestyle Accessory Design: Textile Design, Apparel Design, and Lifestyle Accessory Design

Faculty of Communication Design: Graphic Design, Animation Film Design, Film & Video Communication, Exhibition Design, and Photography Design

Faculty of IT Integrated Design: New Media Design, Information Design, Interaction Design, and Digital Game Design

Faculty of Interdisciplinary Design Studies: Strategic Design Management, Design for Retail Experience, and a common interdisciplinary stream for undergraduate, postgraduate, and research programmes







6.3 ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

BACHELOR OF DESIGN (B.Des.)

The programme spans four years (eight semesters) including a two-semester Design Foundation Studies programme. Despite being a generic design programme, it offers project-level specialisation in different areas of:

Ceramic & Glass Design, Furniture & Interior Design, and Product Design

Communication Design

Animation Film Design, Exhibition Design, Film & Video Communication, and Graphic Design

Textile and Apparel Design

Textile Design

Interactive areas of project-level specialisation are offered in 19 Master of Design (M.Des.) programmes:

The M.Des. programme is offered in 19 specialisations

(disciplines) across all five faculty streams. Interactive areas of project-level specialisation are offered in:

Animation Film Design: classical animation, computer animation, model animation, and animation for the web

Apparel Design: ready-to-wear range for women, costumes for film and theatre, work and protective wear, and accessory design

Ceramic & Glass Design: lifestyle products, studio pottery, and sanitaryware

Design for Retail Experience: Designed for the candidates from various backgrounds, it looks at the retail industry in a holistic manner.

Digital Game Design: To train, nurture, and combine students' creative imagination with latest technologies to create games and experiences. The graduates of this programme will be highly required in the digital entertainment and computer gaming Industry.

Film & Video Communication: marketing communication (advertising and corporate films), social communication (developmental and educational short



films), and design for tourism industry

Furniture & Interior Design: home furniture system, office furniture system, and retail furniture system

Graphic Design: design for publications, marketing communications, and social and developmental communications

Information Design: A multidimensional programme that synchronises the fields of design, visual aesthetics, computer science, statistics, and humanities to inculcate a transdisciplinary proficiency into the future information design professionals.

Interaction Design: design and behaviour of various forms of digital products ranging from mobile phones, web-based to dynamic ones in gaming, education, transportation, healthcare, banking, and retail and other domains

Lifestyle Accessory Design: personal accessory products, products for living, and workspaces

New Media Design: web design, game design, interactive media, and software industry

Photography Design: visual artists, photographers, and cinematographers

Product Design: consumer products (electronic and entertainment products, white goods), transportation, capital equipment and machine tools, and toys

This programme gives impetus to design research priorities for its current faculty in collaboration with researchers who are selected as Ph.D. scholars under faculty supervision.








6.4 EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

The institute is equipped with the Skill Development Lab, Design Vision Centre, Innovation Lab, and specialised labs for ceramics and glass, leather and plastics, textile and apparel design studios, computer labs, and the Knowledge Management Centre (housing approximately 63000 books and a large collection of journals, e-Books, e-Journals, audio-visual materials, and prototypes).

It has a contemporary IT Centre and other wellequipped labs with about 1000 computers (in Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru campuses) including 700 high-end machines and software. The entire campus, including hostels, is connected with Local Area Networking for both the internet and intranet facilities with around 1800 connections and Wi-Fi.

The Design Vision Centre with Rapid Prototyping (RP) and High-Performance Visualisation (HPV) solutions are other significant facilities. Photography studio and print labs, video and animation studios, and skilled technical staff assist design students in their learning process. All these studios are continuously upgraded and equipped to handle professional work and sponsored research in addition to meeting with the training needs of students.








6.5 K-PORTAL

Admissions 2022–23

Admissions 2022–23 to the Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) and Master of Design (M.Des.) programmes were announced in October 2021.

Applicants (for NID Ahmedabad, NID Andhra Pradesh, NID Assam, NID Haryana and NID Madhya Pradesh) to the M.Des. and B.Des. programmes were required to apply online only on the official admissions website http:// admissions.nid.edu.

The Design Aptitude Test (DAT) (Prelims) for admissions to the M.Des. & B.Des. programmes for the academic year 2022–23 were conducted at 34 and 38 test centres respectively across 23 cities (Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Dehradun, Guwahati, Goa, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Kolkata, Kurukshetra, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur, New Delhi, Patna, Raipur, Ranchi, Shimla, Thiruvananthapuram, and Vijayawada) in India on January 2, 2022.

In all, the B.Des. programme received 12537 applications. In all, 11780 candidates (including Overseas candidates) appeared for the DAT Prelims exam for 144 seats (including 19 supernumerary 28 seats in Overseas category) in B.Des.; 75 seats at NID Andhra Pradesh, 75 seats at NID Assam, 75 seats at NID Haryana, and 86 seats at NID Madhya Pradesh (including 11 supernumerary seats in Overseas category). While the total number of applicants for the M.Des. programme across 19 disciplines was 3892, in all, 3562 candidates (including Overseas candidates) appeared for 402 seats in the M.Des. programme.

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic and the uncertainties arising thereof, the date for the announcement of the results of M.Des. and B.Des. DAT Prelims have still not been decided.

6.7 41ST CONVOCATION 2021

NID's 41st Convocation Day 2021 was held virtually on September 25, 2021 at the NID Ahmedabad Campus.

In all, **312** students graduated from various disciplines: **102** students from the 4-year Bachelor of Design (B.Des.); **01** student from the 4-year Graduate Diploma Programme in Design (GDPD); and **209** students from the 2¹/₂-year Master of Design (M.Des.).

On this occasion, Shri Praveen Nahar, Director, National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad gave an overview of NID's key activities that took place during the year. He spoke about the continuous disruption caused by the pandemic, which in turn, reshaped how NID taught, learnt, worked, formed a community, and how the institute lived out its mission. He took pride in the resilience displayed by the young designers through which they overcame the adversity of the past one and a half years and congratulated them for adeptly pivoting their practice and producing some astonishing work that really exemplified the spirit of the ingenuity at NID.

Shri Jamshyd Godrej, Chairperson, Governing Council, National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad, in his presidential address, congratulated the graduating students for collectively being able to adapt to this new challenge and managing to complete their graduation projects.

He also congratulated NID for taking timely measures to adapt to the pandemic situation and to ensure that not only were academic activities of the institute facilitated remotely as well as on campus in a hybrid mode, but national/international events were organised, COVID-response projects were undertaken, and admissions processes successfully conducted.

He explained that the industry and society in general had suffered due to this pandemic and NID graduates



will be expected to actively participate in providing innovative design solutions. Many disruptions have happened across sectors in the 'new normal' which also creates new challenges and opportunities for young designers, and it is important to bring in a humanitarian approach to design practices.

This year, **Prof. Patrick Whitney**, **Professor in Residence**, **Department of Health Policy and Management**, **Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health**, **USA**, and **Pioneer of Human-Centred Design**, was invited to deliver the Convocation address.

In his Convocation address, he briefly gave insights on the recent history of design and impact of designers on manufacturing which he also felt was changing. He cautioned the young designers against the challenges of the modern era, such as the innovation gap, economies of scale, and reflection deficit disorder. He encouraged them to look at the world in a broader way rather than designing products and messages, as was done so well by the Eameses and other heroes of the last century.

He felt that that they will need to look at broader things including production capabilities of business models, value webs, systems of offerings, the aspirations of users. They will be required to help organisations overcome their desire for certain solutions for identifying certain solutions before they commence a project and instead, the new way of exploring things would be experimenting with everything from business models through production



capability to user experience which the students will need to prototype for organizations to help them create a better world for us. He felt that they were at the beginning of this economy of choice, and it was their job to work in a different way that can help save their country, region, and the world.

Events Organised during the Convocation:

- From September 13, 2021 onwards, the convocation celebrations commenced with 'YD Talks', where young designers shared their graduating projects and talked about their NID experience, and several graduates made their presentations through this forum.
- YD virtual exhibition was organized which enabled the viewers to take a glance at the graduation projects. The show was also put up physically across the three campuses for those who were able to visit in the following months.
- 'Lines of Sight', the annual design show presenting the work produced in NID over the past year through degree projects, workshops, studio courses, electives, and international exchanges, was organised on a virtual platform. 'Lines of Sight' sought to document, curate, and exhibit the pluralities in NID's unique ways of seeing as design students, practitioners, and as a collective. In the past, NID has looked at projects that push boundaries through 'Alt+YD' in 2019 and reframed projects into inquiries through 'Lines of Inquiry' in 2020.
- As part of the 2021 Convocation Week and in conjunction with the Annual Design Show 2021 'Points of View', a forum for dialogue between young designers, practicing professionals, and academic leaders too was organised.
- Along with the 'Lines of Sight' event, the Toy Innovation E-symposium was organised along with the virtual toy exhibition on 'Play, Learn, and Design', celebrating the spirit of mapping innovative approaches in the area of toys and games for creating joyful childhood experiences.





6.11 EDUCATION AT NID: THE GLOBAL CONTEXT


NID has MoUs with 100 leading universities/institutions of repute overseas to strengthen collaborative academic relationships. This facilitates exchange programmes for students and faculty and encourages collaborative research activities through seminars and workshops. All this is done with the aim of placing Indian design perspectives in the global context. These exchange programmes enable both faculty and students to gain wider exposure and understanding about global design.

The COVID-19 pandemic continued to impact the international activities of NID. Faculty visits abroad were either cancelled or postponed until further notice though they continued to participate online in various fora/discussions with international partners. The student exchange programme for foreign students at NID was suspended and the annual Open Electives were organized online.

 British Council's "Going Global Partnerships -Exploratory Grant" has been awarded to NID and its MoU partner, Central St. Martins, London, University of the Arts London (UAL) for the proposal Creativity and Global Challenges: Creating Change through Making. The Lead Researchers are **Prof. Rathna Ramanathan** (UAL) and **Shilpa Das (Dr.)** (NID).

This grant is aimed at India-UK partnerships for the co-creation of joint programmes of study. This will support nascent partnerships that require assistance to create strong plans for TNE (Transnational Education) and teaching collaborations. Awardees will jointly develop courses that meet global standards and allow easy credit comparability. The grant may be given to a consortium of up to four UK and Indian institutional partnerships.

 Students of NID participated in the Annual Global Grad Show at Dubai. This year this show was held in the format of interactive online exhibition by way of videos, animation features, virtual tours, interactive multimedia elements and other modes. It is a programme for university graduates and professors; a platform for promotion, collaboration and development of projects addressing challenges faced by people and communities around the planet, created by academics in the fields of technology, science, and design. It connects





graduates directly with press, industry, and potential investors. Out of the 26 students who had submitted their projects, ProKids" by **Atharva Mandhare** (B.Des., Product Design) was selected for the show.

We witnessed a collective spirit of survival that prompted us to see and experience things in a new light. Today, the world is more connected than before, and a strong sense of consciousness has prevailed.

The present that we live in and the idea of the future that we envision has also expanded. During the pandemic, mental health and well-being has emerged as a major concern. Home has become a multidimensional platform positioning itself in between the old concepts of Outside and Inside. Chaos and Order, Frugality and Innovation, Material and Making, everything was witnessed in these intimate home spaces. The notions of proximity and distance have also changed. The neighbourhood has again become important to us. Localism, our dependence on local systems, has made us re-value things which are within our hand's reach.

The pandemic also made us question our notions of being a global community. Technology-driven, virtuality-enabled, trans-located, co-working and co-creative spaces have dissolved the limitations of physical geographies. The fragility of the unconnected systems in remote and vernacular setups have also become prominently evident. As the technologyenabled creators have thrived, the rural craftspersons, the small-scale makers, and the un-connected artists and creators continue to struggle. Although the traditional creator was challenged due to the shrinking physicality and expanding virtuality, the scope for opportunities has also shifted and increased in some sectors. As individuals and communities, we have progressed to become more adaptive and open to newer possibilities and experimentation. Perhaps it is also the time to rethink inclusivity along with a conscious adherence to the sustainable development goals.

Is the pandemic the paradoxical-pause which the planet's inhabitants needed, or is it a provocation to make us stop in our heels, reflect, rethink, and come together to redefine human civilisation?

These Open Electives were conducted remotely from April 5–16, 2021, and 28 workshops were offered to 418 students of B.Des. 4th semester and M.Des. 2nd semester, across the three campuses by 50 instructors from diverse backgrounds and geographies, spread across five time zones.

Titled 'PLAY PARADIGMS_Explore.Experiment. Experience', the Open Electives 2022 were held from February 14–25, 2022, offered in 3 modes, Online + On-Campus + Hybrid (Online + On-Campus).

These Open Electives 2022 were centred around the need to acknowledge the shift in people's mindset towards the neo-ideals of purpose, rejuvenation, and transformation, and seek to understand and

celebrate the spirit of resilience and playfulness. As we explore the area of play, we may also discover new convergences between the real and the fictional, the virtual and the tangible, and the maker and the thinker. At the same time, we may also question social stereotypes, identities, behaviour, speculating and imagining a future through the lens of play.

7. NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN: EXTENSION CAMPUSES

7.1 NID GANDHINAGAR CAMPUS

Considering new initiatives in education and the need for clearly focused research-led postgraduate programmes, an extension campus was developed at Gandhinagar in a 15-acre plot in July 2004. The first phase of the construction project covering the hostel block, faculty residence, and academic block was completed with procurement and installation of interior systems/LAN/WAN and the academic activities commenced from the new Academic Block from the Academic Year 2008–09. To start with, the postgraduate courses in Software and User Interface Design, Information and Digital Design, and New Media Design were conducted from the transit campus, Gandhinagar. With the completion of the first phase of construction (Academic Block and Living Spaces), four more postgraduate programmes; namely, Lifestyle Accessory Design, Apparel Design & Merchandising, Toy & Game Design, and Strategic Design Management from the Ahmedabad Campus were moved to the Gandhinagar Campus from the Academic Year 2008–09. With the completion of phase-II of the Academic Block, two more postgraduate programmes; namely, Photography Design and Transportation & Automobile Design were moved from the Ahmedabad Campus

to the Gandhinagar Campus from the Academic Year 2011–12.

Highlights of the Year

- An M.Des. student from the Lifestyle Accessory Design discipline, Simran Bahmania was declared winner in the CaratLane Designacathon challenge 2021. The CaratLane Designathon received over 400 entries. She was also declared the student of the year in the category of jewellery design at the National Jewellery Awards 2021 organised by GJC and the World Design Council.
- Amresh Panigrahi, Discipline Lead, Lifestyle
 Accessory Design discipline, was invited to the
 DESIS International Coordination Committee (ICC).
 The ICC is composed of ten people from across the world which is selected among the Labs' active participants of the Assembly, and they collaborate for the deployment of the following activities:
 o To evaluate the new Lab applications.
 - o To evaluate the new Initiatives proposed.
 - o To define the agenda for the Assembly meeting.



- o To implement the decisions taken by the Assembly To promote some special events.
- o To promote editorial activities.
- o To direct the editorial line for the website.
- o To deal with any legal issues.
- o To give continuity to the governance model.
- Amresh Panigrahi was also invited as a panellist to present a talk on - "Crafting Khadi: Way of Living -Design for a New Craftsmanship" in the round table webinar on "Crafting New Social Economies" x UAL COP26. This event, promoted by the DESIS Network and the UAL "Carnival of Crisis", a significant move by Desis for the centre of the discussion and its political sense, was organised in parallel to the COP26 UN Climate Summit.
- Amresh Panigrahi was invited as a Keynote speaker to present a talk on "Indian Street vendors" - A Paradigm of localism, Indian's Case study in the event JOP21, Brazil. The JOP'Design 2021 conference on "Local knowledge and emerging thematic on Design" organised by the Postgraduate Program in Design, Federal University of Maranhão (UFMA), Brazil. The speakers from different countries talked about local knowledge and design domains. This conference on design research was held online from September 22–24, 2021.
- Ashok Mondal, Associate Senior Faculty, Lifestyle Accessory Design was invited as a distinguished Panelist for a panel discussion on Indigenisation and Indianisation of Assistive Technologies for Self-Reliance (with reference to Pandemics) at the 6th India International Science Festival (IISF) on Assistive Technologies and Divyangjan". The event was organised by the Ministry of Science & Technology, Ministry of Earth Sciences and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in association with the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and Vijnana Bharati (VIBHA).

- As part of the Toyctahon online event on April 15, 2021, Austin Davis, Faculty, Toy & Game Design was invited to be part of the team and his lecture on "Play Factor in Toys/Games" was recorded and made live on the MHRD YouTube channel.
- The National Education Policy was released on July 29, 2020, giving its recommendations for a vision for the nation's education scenario. Following this, the Ministry of Education came up with an action plan for different tasks. One of the tasks is to Development of Fun Based Learning (Student Appropriate) Tools in Multiple Languages to Promote and Popularize Indian Languages, Arts, and Culture. In this regard, the Department of Education in Arts and Aesthetics, one of the Departments of NCERT, has taken up a programme on the above task, which has been approved by the Programme Advisory Committee. A Planning Group was identified for the same to work on the identification of themes, techniques, and tools, designing events, etc. to be open for participation by students across the country and Austin Davis was appointed as a member of the planning group who then chalked out a plan for the said task in Delhi.
- On November 16, Austin Davis was also invited to speak in the Applied Games Track at the India Game Developer Conference (IGDC)
- The Toy & Game Design department and UNICEF GLOBAL collaborated on a Paid + Live classroom project. As part of the classroom project, ageappropriate child development toys for 0.5 to 5-year-old children suffering from severe & moderate acute malnutrition were developed.
- On March 12, 2022, for the annual Iran Toy Festival, Shekhar Bhattacharjee and Austin Davis, faculty from Toy & Game Design were invited for an online session as part of the festival. They presented on the topics of "Playful Learning" and "Toy Design Process".

7.2 NID BENGALURU CAMPUS

The academic year 2020–21 was affected by the global pandemic. The students of all the five disciplines at NID Bengaluru campus: Digital Game Design, Design for Retail Experience, Information Design, Interaction Design, and Universal Design in general, participated in the process with great patience and resilience. Students of two successive batches of the academic years 2020 and 2021 attended the classes in total online mode. With meticulous planning of the timetables, eventually, the courses were offered in hybrid mode alternatively to these batches so that the health protocols could be implemented and followed efficiently. The possibility of a 'hybrid mode' emerged as the precautionary norms were relaxed. It allowed students to access the campus partially to make use of the resources and facilities as



part of the ongoing online courses. It is helping mostly for those courses requiring practical outcomes and are dependent on the systems and workshop. The batch of 2020 benefited most by this provision since they were completing their several assignments from the Studio and Design Project courses and required the facilities like a workshop, Cintiq lab, laser cutting machine, 3D printing for their design prototypes and models. They also benefited greatly from the face-to-face interaction with the faculties available on the campus.

While the batch of 2021 was completely in online mode, the 2020 batch was allowed to take advantage of the hybrid mode. Students of this batch are using the facilities following the strict protocols of the pandemic.

Nijoo Dubey, Designer, Universal Design discipline, was invited as a member of National Award Selection Committee Meeting for shortlisting entries from Southern region held at Handicrafts Service Centre, O/o. Development Commissioner (Handicrafts), with the Director MSME being the Chairperson of the committee.



Balaji Rengarajan, Principal Designer, Universal Design discipline participated as a panel member to select 'expert mentor' to train/prepare the finalists (Industrial Design) for the upcoming WorldSkills-Shanghai 2022. He was also the domain expert Invitee, for the panel discussion "Consultation / Roundtable Discussion on Draft Rules for Safety Standards for Children on Motorized Two Wheelers" organised online by the CEE Centre for Environment Education on November 17, 2021.

Mamata Rao, Dean, NID Bengaluru Campus was invited as a panellist in various prestigious fora/sessions. She was also the invited speaker for the Webinar titled "Enhancing Digital Heritage experiences in Indian Galleries, Libraries , Archives Monuments, and Museums, (GLAM)" on June 7, 2021, organised by Kala Nidhi Division of Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA).

On November 24, 2021, as part of 'Novembre Numérique', the digital art festival organised by the French Institute, **Christian Pizafy**, the Director of the Alliance Française de Bangalore invited students & faculty of NID; 35 students and 2 faculty members **(Jagriti Galphade** and **Unais Sait)** from Interaction Design participated in the event and interacted with both the Director - Alliance Française de Bangalore, Christian Pizafy and François Serre, the specialist in 3D Imaging.

Babita Naagar, Shrishti Priya, Gaurav Singh, and Himanshu Prasad, students of Interaction Design discipline won the Designathon organised by ValueLabs on the October 31, 2021.

This design hackathon allows the design students to compete against the best design students across the globe in a fast-paced environment, earn recognition, get visibility to showcase their solution to the global audience of DI and get rewarded with 1 Lakh Rupees cash prize. This year's theme was "Regenerate & Evolve".

Vikash Konathal, student of Universal Design discipline authored a paper Understanding the Impact of COVID 19 and designing a flexible business model for Fashion brands, which was selected to be published in the Atlantis press and also was presented in the Tarumanagara International Conference on the Applications of Social sciences & Humanities.





8. KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT CENTRE (KMC) AND NID ARCHIVES

Over the past six decades, the institute's Knowledge Management Centre (KMC)/ Resource Centre (RC)/ has grown leaps and bounds with respect to the contents and the knowledge generated internally as a part of academics, consultancy, and research.

The mission of KMC/RC is to proactively facilitate resources for academic and design research endeavours of NID across Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru campuses.

KMC is considered as the backbone of the institute, and it has embraced a multifaceted approach in managing print, digital, audio-visual material, and prototypes in a seamless manner. The collective strength of all resources at the KMC is aimed at giving the power to provide services under one roof, with online resources to faculty members, students, researchers, and reference requests to the corporate bodies and institutes associated with design.

Details of various resources housed at KMC:

Print Resources

The KMC has a wide range of books in its resources on design, science and technology, art & architecture, paintings, history, and humanities to name a few. Presently, the collection has approximately 74571 books and the periodical section has nearly 244 current subscriptions of journals with nearly 5858 back volumes at all three campuses. The rare and out of print collection includes archival collections on art, architecture, paintings, and history.

Document Collection

The document collection contains more than 7621 student graduation project documents, colloquium papers, craft documentations, and project reports at all three campuses. There are several other reports and documentations on various projects NID was involved with during the last five decades, which are unique with innovative themes and research-oriented studies.

Audio Visual Resources

The unique collection of audio-visual material includes films, (Audio Cassettes, Audio LP's, Audio Tapes, Audio CD, Digital Audio Tapes (DAT), Films (16mm & 35 mm), Filmstrips, Microfilms & microfiche, Slides (Transparencies), Video Cassettes (U-matic, VHS, Betamax, Betacam), Video CD and DVD) contains NID's own works as well as the ones collected from other sources. These are mostly on the topics of design, film classics, and of course NID's own experimental and animation films. The audio collection contains hundreds of hours of music, both Indian as well as Western classical, Folk, Jazz, Pop and so on. This collection also includes recordings of lectures and speeches held at NID, literature readings as well as sound effects, which are very important resources for both students and faculty in their design projects covering diverse themes and ideas. The visual collection consisting of nearly 80,000 transparencies from the early 1960s till date is unique and features Indian landscape, art, architecture, and design along with topics such as fairs and festivals, people, traditions, and culture.

As part of the enhancement of its resources, the KMC will be purchasing/subscribing to more E-Books and E-Journals during the coming months along with design related databases which will help students and faculty in their academic and research pursuits.

Prototype Collection

The Prototype Collection is a display of furniture designs and other products from internationally renowned designers such as Charles Eames from the USA, Le Corbusier from France, Marcel Breuer, and Ludwig Mies van Der Rohe from Germany, Poul Kjaerholm from Denmark, Bruno Mathsson from Sweden, Eero Saarinen from the USA, and Hans J Wegner from Denmark among others. This classic collection is displayed to encourage the study of design by inspiring budding designers with examples of the highest standards. These were designed for everyday life in Europe and America, and they emphasise the challenges faced by designers with respect to new materials, new technologies, design processes, and aesthetics. Some of the designs are very artistic, truly classic, and captivating. This collection of the KMC is versatile with various designs of furniture, products, ceramics, and kitchenware among others.

Conservation and Preservation of Resources at KMC

The KMC has started rectifying torn, damaged rare books for restoration and preservation. About 399 rare books were preserved and conserved through INTACH, Lucknow in 2017. The conservation is a continuous and long-term activity; so far, 26 Crafts documents and 43 Diploma projects have been conserved and preserved till 2018 and 3 old influential magazines published by NID students during 1980s were digitised and conserved in 2019 through INTACH, Lucknow.

Resource Guides

The KMC is providing resource guides to the faculty members from September 2019. Resource guides are bibliographic details of books, audio visual materials and diploma/graduation projects falling into the respective courses that are scheduled in the academic timetable of B. Des. and M. Des. programmes across three campuses.

Soft Copies of Craft Documentation and Diploma/ Graduation Projects Provided to Students During the Online Mode of Educational Activities:

In order to support academics and research while considering students' request and the approval of the competent authority, during the year 2021–22, the KMC has provided soft copies of 349 diploma/ graduation projects to 144 students and 9 faculty members and 173 Craft Documentations to 88 students and 6 faculty members.

Remote Login Credentials have been provided to 331 students.

WGSN accounts were created for 44 students during the year.

Contents pages and chapters of Books and E-books have been provided to 34 students, 125 articles (PDFs) have been provided to 90 faculty members, 33 students, and 2 staff members; 201 eBooks (PDFs) have been provided to 139 faculty members and 62 students; 86 eBook links have been provided to 48 faculty members, and 38 students as per their request during the year.

NID ARCHIVES

Introduction

NID Archives is the collection of materials including images, objects, prototypes, drawings, and other original documents. This collection is housed in the KMC and other departments and can be accessed for research and teaching purposes. NID Archives acquires and preserves materials of value specifically to institutional history and broadly to design history. Over the years, the KMC staff has provided support for students, faculty, and researchers from across the world who request access to the materials for their academic work. NID Archives contributes to knowledge production and to the dissemination of its collections within and beyond the institute. This has mostly been in the form of loan of archival materials for exhibitions and image licences for publication.



Mission

- To expand NIDs international reach, reputation, and impact.

Objectives

- The primary objective to establish the archives was due to its outstanding universal value as it is historically and artistically irreplaceable.
- Establish guidelines for accession and acquisition of materials of importance. Since archiving of both historical and current material is of primary importance in order to not lose a huge part of the design heritage of South Asia.
- The main consideration for building an archive includes conservation as the physical condition of the historical materials is a big concern and there is a need for urgently implementing plans to safeguard the materials while setting up an archive.
- This includes conservation (as per the necessity and based on their condition) and digitisation of the negatives, positives, prints, drawings, posters, and audio-visual materials so that the digital images can be accessed and preserved for posterity. And the physical material can be conserved and stored in a secure place so that any further deterioration of the material may be halted.
- Explore and find ways to engage with the archives and contribute further to the existing design discourse.





Activities Held:

- Archives received Wikimedia Grant (March 2021–November 2022) under the banner of Art+Feminism for Women in Design events, which helped us create and improve pages on Gira Sarabhai, Helena Perheentupa, Nina Sabnani, Gita Mayor, and NID Ahmedabad. The grant supports organising meetups, panel discussions & edit-athons.
- Participated in and co-organised the 'Learn' session on June 12, 2022 for Milli Consortium during International Archives Week 2021. Tanishka Kachru moderated the session: Learning through the Archives, where NID Photography Design Alumni Siva Sai Jeeva and Pavithra Ramanujam participated. Faculty members from Photography Design Rishi Singhal and Amarnath Praful made a presentation in the session Archives and the Digital Humanities. Lalitha Poluru (Dr.) participated in the session An Archive Flyover briefly introduced the NID Archive.
- Launched the Archives Public Programmes with the inaugural theme Experiments in Art and Technology in India, researched and assembled by Suvani Suri and Shreyasi Pathak was announced during the International Archives Week 2021. The five sessions ran from July to October 2021. The Instagram page archives_nid was also launched during the same period.
- Bhakruti Rashtrapal, Project Associate joined NID Archives in July 2021.
- Dhananjay Pandey and Ashin S, students of M.Des. Photography Design (2020 batch) joined as interns for a period of 6 weeks (Aug - September, 2021).
- Launched the '60 Years, 60 Objects' research project to celebrate the sixtieth anniversary of the foundation of NID. Suchitra Balasubrahmanyan (Dr.) joined Archives as Senior Research Associate for the project in December 2021.
- Conducted sessions on introduction to the archival materials for the 2-week course Exhibition

9. RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

Design research is a proactive and exploratory way to develop design practice and education. The institute aims at creating a new body of knowledge on and through design research. The institute conducts design research in the areas of Industrial Design, Communication Design, Textile and Apparel Design, Lifestyle Accessory Design, IT Integrated Design, and Design Management in domains related to industrial, social, and cultural concerns through basic and applied research, through experimental development and other activities.

NID's design research mandate also includes setting up of Design Research Chairs, which act as catalysts for collaborative research opportunities at NID. Chairholders or Fellows and their associated labs promote holistic design thinking backed by comprehensive research, culminating in futuristic visions, envisaging a better quality of life.

NID's research initiatives are fully integrated into its undergraduate and postgraduate curricula.

RAILWAY DESIGN CENTRE (RDC)

Centre Head: Mohammed Naim Shaikh

National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad and Ministry of Railways (Railway Board), New Delhi signed an MoU on April 10, 2015. It aims at collaboration between NID and the Railway Board in all fields of design relevant to rail transport and allied activities, with a view to design, research, and develop innovative and the best design ideas and reinforce the best design practice in transportation design for the Indian Railways. This will be done with the participation of young designers, design service providers, design researchers, and design professionals and practitioners.

Focus Areas

- Improvements in station areas such as colour scheme of the station buildings, platform shelter, station name boards, and signage and display boards.
- Improvements in coaches including coach layouts, exterior & interior colour scheme, lighting & airconditioning, signal & telecom, and passenger amenities.
- Freight service systems and miscellaneous items such as design of improved working tools for track maintainers, light weight inspection trolley.
- Environmental concerns and thrust areas and public relation issues.
- Designing the Indian Railways logo, stamps/coins for special occasions, designing railway exhibition stalls.
- Online Services and other such developments which come under the scope of railways.

Ongoing Projects:

Design Review Tool for RDC: GP Project by Jeevan Jai Raj, PDPG18

Guide: Mohammed Naim Shaikh

Brief: Development of tool kit/simulation/digital/ virtual journey experience using digital and physical interaction for design and engineering review extended to VR / AR / MR technologies.

Description: The project explores and develops immersive and intuitive design assessment tools in

Extended Reality(XR). XR bridges the gap between the physical world and digital interfaces. It allows us to see and experience beyond the physical reality. For Railway Design Centre, XR can expedite the Design Process. Design reviews in XR will help identify mistakes, risks, and concern areas for optimisation or further improvements, adding value to the project.

Progress: The current iteration of the project showcases three Coach types with configurable exterior graphics and one interior scene with options of customizable and interactable objects. In addition to the coaches, the environment in which these experiences are carried out is also customisable. Due to the current technological limitations, high-res 3D models and their customisation has become challenging but it's not something that cannot be achieved by more powerful and efficient systems.







Chair Car Seating Styling for Indian Railways-GP Project by Araisrang Brahma, PDUG2016

Guide: Mohammed Naim Shaikh

Brief: To design and develop a range of seating for different types of travel classes in Indian Railway Coach(es) considering the culture and values of Indian context. The seating arrangements and distribution may be different in terms of class, but it should be comfortable, convenient & safe for any



passengers travelling by train. The seat materials may differ between the classes but should feel seamless considering its thickness, pattern and styling. It must be durable and in parallel, require only minimal maintenance & repair.

Progress: Travelled for field research on train seats evaluation by observation of passengers sitting behaviour. The analysis has been carried out through observation and photographs during the travel journey back-and-forth from Ahmedabad - Surat Railway stations. Sitting manners and practices of various individuals were documented via photographs and observations to evaluate the aspects of the human sitting postures in relation to their activities.

The travel journey duration is of 3 hr 15 min (approx.) from one station to another; total trip duration covered is more than 6 hrs. Research has been carried out in Karnavati and Shataby passengers travelling by train. The seat materials may differ between the classes but should feel seamless considering its thickness, pattern and styling. It must be durable and in parallel, require only minimal maintenance & repair.





Post-Covid System Design for Railway Stations & Train Coaches: A GP Project by Amal Teerthankar, B.Des. 2017 (Product Design)

Guide: Gayatri Menon (Dr.)

The year 2020 showed India a glimpse of how life would be without trains. As the coronavirus lockdown was announced on March 24, the Railways for the first time in its 167-year-old history shut down all its services. People stranded across the country and who usually looked to the Railways to ferry them home, were left without their lifeline.

Modular Designs of Seats/Berths in LHB coach-GP Project by Aravind Rajesh, FID, UG 2017

Project Guide: Pravinsinh Solanki

Project Brief: To research the present concerns with seats and berth and as a result design modular furniture in an LHB coach.

Concluded part: The project is progressing through its anthropometric and ergonomics research phase. The passenger seating design system of Korean High-speed rails was studied (Applied Ergonomics Vol. 29, No. 6, pp. 507Đ519, 1998) to understand their approach of systematically redesigning/ modifying existing vehicular seats and to have an insight into their coach seat layout. Anthropometric study based on activities mapped (from secondary research) inside the train is being done.



Commencing part: Primary research needs to be done. Mock-up and ideation underway.

Railway Catering-Galley Equipment Bars, Cars and Convenience Pantry Car Development- GP Project by ABHINAV. S, FID,UG2017 Guide: Pravinsinh Solanki

Brief: The purpose is to research and comprehend the existing challenges that Indian railway catering is experiencing with pantry cars, galley equipment, bars, or carts, and to come up with a viable solution.

From the study of how food is transported from the pantry to the coaches, it was concluded that the project would be on a galley trolley that would facilitate the transportation of food from one point to another.

Secondary research on the circulation of food, beverages, the types of food and beverages, their sizes, volume occupied, materials involved was done. A study of existing ways of food transportation in other modes of transport was also done.

From the study a full-scale mock-up was made to understand and study the organization, the volume distribution of the objects inside and the space occupied by the trolley. As per the research done based on the existing catering system in the premium trains a new concept was made to fit into the current system. A mock-up was developed based on the new concept and basic testing was done. Further evaluation and development of the concept is under way.

To Design and Improve the Overall User Experience of LHB Train Lavatories Focusing Especially on Chair Car Coaches- GP Project by Yash Monde




Brief: Improving User Experience of toilets in LHB Chair Car passenger coaches.

Project Status: 3D prototype in progress.

Universal, affordable and sustainable access to WaSH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) facilities is one of the key public health issues in developing countries and the challenge today for a mass transportation system like railways is to manage and maintain the hygiene standards, accessibility and functioning of toilets in a sustainable manner over long distances.

Work on this project began with a vision to provide safely managed and improved sanitation services and to reduce discomfort for staff and passengers by bringing appropriate changes in the built environment, validated by research all aimed towards improving the experience of using toilets on trains in India.





Ideation: Based on the research synthesis, different interventions and different levels has been started.

Improvement in Interiors of LHB Coaches During Pandemic-GP Project by Akansha Mary Bara

Guide: Pravinsinh Solanki

Brief: The purpose is to research on the feasible measures that combined could restore and increase the confidence of passengers in rail travel following the Covid-19 pandemic and to provide a trusted space for passengers that could limit the risk of infection.

Ever since the outbreak of Corona Virus 2019 pandemic, the railway frontline leaders are not only trying to prevent and get the control over the spread of the pandemic but also planning, organising, and coordinating the utilization of the medical and all other methods effectively and efficiently in order to





minimize the losses and sufferings of human lives and recouping the global wellbeing at large.

CENTRE FOR BAMBOO INITIATIVES (CFBI) Centre Head: Susanth C S

NID's Centre for Bamboo Initiatives (CFBI) has been set up at various campuses for activities related to Bamboo-based research, design, technical development, and training. This is a platform for faculty members, students and designers for innovation, experimentation, and building new resources for the bamboo sector in India and abroad. The CFBI also supports entrepreneurs and connects various stakeholders for building up bamboo-based ecosystems to popularise its applications. The centre also participates in various events nationally and internationally to promote new developments taking place at NID for the advantage of the bamboo sector. The CFBI also organises international seminars and workshops and World Bamboo Day events at the NID Bengaluru campus for the promotion of bamboo as a sustainable material for day-to-day life. New product development, joints, finishes, introduction of new tools and equipment, and building curriculum and institutions are some of the major activities taken under by this centre.

Bamboo Fibre Development & Exploration

An internal initiative has been taken to explore the possibility of natural bamboo fibre from the basic extraction to refinement and to its product application. This initiative started in the month of January 2022 and the exploration of fibre extraction has taken place at various levels. Mr. Unnikrishnan Nair, a retired Engineer from Kerala has technically guided our team to experiment to extract the fibres from bamboo poles. Thereafter lots of effort was made to create the softer fibre which can be applied for various uses. As a test product we are trying to develop an artist brush which requires softer fibre and quality to absorb moisture and retain the fines of strokes. This is in the initial prototype stages. In the first stage bamboo has been soaked in the caustic soda which will help in removing the lignin and to soften to extract fibre and various methods used to remove the pith to soften

it. Further softening can be achieved by dipping the fibre in Hydrogen peroxide and later chlorine can



be used for bleaching to make it more cream colour. This experiment will continue for more learning and improving the quality of fibre and more applications with it.

Exposure Visit of Artisans on February 22, 2022

As part of the regular exposure visit organized by Foundation of MSME Clusters a group of 23 artisans from Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh visited NID Centre for Bamboo Initiatives for understanding the innovations in bamboo. They have also been introduced to the activities about the bamboo centre and exposed to the new directions NID has taken in bamboo application. Such kind of more visits are planned in the coming months to promote the bamboo application and encourage more entrepreneurs to come to this sector. The team had artisans work in bamboo furniture making, basket weavers, and handicraft makers. There are few entrepreneurs who are into technical development for the sector. These kinds of visits also will help in popularising bamboo activities of NID centre for bamboo initiatives for long term to support various clusters with the help of various state and central departments.





Exposure Visit to NID Centre for Bamboo Initiatives Organised by Foundations of MSME Clusters (FMC), New Delhi and participated by the Artisans from Northeast, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra, a oneday visit to know more about the various bamboo applications using different bamboo species was organised.

This is the first such initiative and more such visits will be organised by the FMC in coming months. There could be a possibility of a 'Training the Trainers' programme for the selected artisans from these groups in future, supported by FMC.

Taiwan-India Bamboo Crafts Exchange and Collaboration Project

A collaborative project between India and Taiwan during the COVID-19, to explore the possibility of working together through online interaction. The project was coordinated by Pravinsinh Solanki from NID (India) side and Mr. Kevin from Taiwan. This collaboration looked into exchanging the ideas using bamboo resources from both countries and many of these were prototyped. Teams from both the sides consist of designers and artisans. The products designed by **Pravinsinh Solanki** and **Susanth C S** from NID were prototyped by the bamboo artist from Taiwan which was using the bamboo species from Taiwan. The designs proposed by Taiwan designers were prototyped at NID and by a few artisans from Tripura, Sikkim, and Kerala. Various bamboo species engineered bamboo with other material combinations and traditional skill sets were considered to develop the products. This was a good experience and set an example to collaborate distantly using digital mediums








and work on specific tasks. Looking at this success CFBI are planning for more such collaborations in the future.

The ICIC started promoting the Craft activity of NID on an online platform for a public viewing: The initiative was taken under ICIC to collaborate with the different NID departments and promote the craft activity and research in a public platform to encourage students, mentors, and craft enthusiasts.

INNOVATION CENTRE FOR NATURAL FIBRE (ICNF) Centre Head: Amit Sinha

NID has set up an Innovation Centre for Natural Fibre (ICNF) at the NID Gandhinagar Campus with a focus on improvement in natural fibres processing techniques, capacity building in natural fibres development, and utilisation through innovation in design, engineering, and technology.

ICNF focuses on the vision to create an innovation driven research culture in areas of sustainability, natural fibres, and materials with the support of stateof-the-art infrastructure and efficient support services, enabling ICNF researchers to explore cutting-edge local, national, and international research with respect for humanity, society, and environment.

After the post-COVID reopening, ICNF head Amit Sinha initiated a dialogue with Edward Brial and John Bertolaso, co-founders of Materra, a UK based startup organisation, actively growing team of designers, engineers, scientists, farmers (and more) on a mission to accelerate the transition to a net-positive fashion industry in harmony with people and planet. Starting at the base of the pyramid, with higher quality and more sustainable raw materials with a focus on building resilient farming systems to empower more sustainable cotton supply chains, they have developed a farming technology to grow cotton sustainably and in a transparent way. The developments of initiations so far include On December 9, 2021, a virtual meeting was held with Materra co-founder **Edward Brial** to understand and discuss the requirements and seek future research and project co-working possibilities with NID students through ICNF to contribute to Materra's initiatives. On January 18, 2022, a virtual meeting with the Materra partners **John Bertolaso** and **Edward Brial** to understand the scope. A possibility to attract research funds was also discussed.

Edward Brial visited ICNF, NID Gandhinagar in February 2022 while travelling to Ahmedabad for his ongoing project: 'Industrial Scale Pilot Farm Development in Gujarat in Partnership with Fashion for Good, Arvind, PVH and Kering'. Plans for a brainstorming workshop on the nature of collaboration with a focused NID group was proposed. A request for the same is awaited. Once received, the details will be discussed with the Head, R&D and the Director NID for guidance before preparing a formal proposal.

Facilitating a Wool Appreciation Course and the Woolmark Performance Challenge 2022 for NID students



He spoke on the National IPR Policy and its objectives, the importance of getting a copyright registration as well as its process, the various kinds of work that are protected under copyright and the licensing and assignment of those rights.

IPR Cell is a part of SSIP grant offered by the Government of Gujarat. Products that have qualified and as approved by the duly appointed IPR Committee for design registrations, copyright and patent are processed further.

SMART HANDLOOMS INNOVATION CENTRE (SHIC) Centre Head: V Sakthivel

To take handlooms to the future, emerging paradigm for its cultural identity and sustainability and with an intent to integrate emerging technologies into creation of smart handlooms the SHIC has been set up with the support of Office of the Commissioner of Textile Development and Director of Handlooms and Textiles, Government of Karnataka for an initial duration of 5 years. The purpose for the centre would be to integrate emerging technologies into creation of handlooms textiles. With an aim for seamless integration of traditional into the technological, this would lead to the creation of next generation of weavers. It also aims to extend continuous design support to the textile sector in the Karnataka State.

SHIC is a resource collaborative which brings together weavers and professionals from diverse fields of design, research, technology, marketing, and signs to make handloom weaving a sustainable livelihood and vibrant craft in Karnataka.

WIRIN Project (Autonomous Vehicle)- WIPRO-IISC –NID Research and Innovation Programme

WIPOD 2.0 project: WIPOD 2.0 is a new area added this year. Wipro already has the car design and robotic furniture. The focus is on UX interactions for - Dashboard, Media & Entertainment, External mobile app, Cabin systems, map & navigation. The vehicle will morph into different modes with robotic furniture. 3 types of communication with humans inside vehicle, outside and remote. Vehicle to vehicle, vehicle to infrastructure with multimodal interactions and phygital interfaces. Intelligent surfaces inside and outside the vehicle and not screens but plain touch surfaces may be considered for exploratory design concepts.



Status of the Project:

- Draft on the state of art of technology and materials for autonomous vehicles
- Early explorations on exterior and interior design visualizations for WIPOD 2.0
- 1st Draft on Creation of user personas for UX in autonomous vehicles for car passengers and driver
- Collation of student work undertaken in the last quarter as part of 'Earn While you Learn Scheme' and classroom explorations
- Secondary research on luxury travel and facilities available for a business class professional. This was followed with primary research with business class travellers to understand their work requirements during travel.
- Primary research to understand requirements to design an autonomous vehicle for an Indian family.

WIRIN Simulator 2.0: This is a continuation of Year 1 work. Here the focus is to look at the simulator interface for the platform with 10 degrees of freedom. The team will continue to build the Framework for scenarios specifically for India.

SEED RESEARCH GRANT FOR EARLY CAREER FACULTY (SRG-ECF)

In order to promote an active research culture and initiating innovative research ideas, the institute has formalised a policy to provide Seed Research Grant to faculty members. The grant shall be utilised towards developing a range of research topics as per the mandate.

As per the 162nd Governing Council, a resolution was passed to extend the Seed Research Grant to all faculty members. Thus, the call was announced for all faculty members on February 24, 2022.

Designing Textiles from Waste: Self Growing Textiles Researcher: Ketan Vadodaria (Dr.)

The research is focused on developing sustainable, compostable biomaterial using microbes from waste. Tried and experimented the process of making biomaterial. Since it involves microbes, extra care has to be taken in terms of parameters, process, and hygiene. Initial trials were conducted but found fungal contamination in the developed samples. At last, with further literature review and experimenting the problem of contamination is almost eliminated.

Indigenous Patterned Textiles

(A Research Study on Indigenous Patternmaking through Jala System in Banaras) Researcher : Shafique Afzal

An initial field visit was conducted in January, to get the ground reality, getting the contacts and other details of the craft.

Aesthetics of Voice in Spatial Audio for Immersive Experience

The visit scheduled in July 2022 focuses on documenting the form and aesthetic emerging out of memories, perceptions, paradoxes and behaviours expressed through spaces and material culture of the middle-class homes of Jaipur. As homes are very private spaces, we need help from local networks for easing people into sharing their experiences with us. In this regard, ground support has been extended by Jaipur Virasat Foundation and Dronah Foundation.

10. NID PRESS


NID Press is an independent publications initiative of the National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad. NID Press covers a broad canvas of publications comprising books, conference proceedings, monographs, archival publications, anthologies, graphic novels, reprints, catalogues, and magazines to name a few. Each of these corrals design activities; pedagogic practices and theories; contemporary issues; social concerns; historical development; economic, political, and environmental contexts; global connections; and extrapolates the philosophical developments in design. With its renewed mandate, NID Press will actively facilitate the commissioning of publications from its vast alumni group thereby bringing into the public domain, a mélange of deliberations on design. In the recent times, several publications from NID Press have been platforms for students, faculty, staff, and alumni to articulate their academic and philosophical perspectives on design as praxis and design as a philosophy.

Through its various publications, NID Press endeavours to turn the spotlight on various perspectives on design in both the local contexts and global scenarios.

11. CENTRE FOR TEACHING & LEARNING (CTL)

CTL recognises that there is a growing need for design educators in India. Research on design education has been an underexplored area in India and provides a potential to initiate research, experiments, and innovation-led programmes for the future. This can support the need of improving the quality of education experiences through the education and training of design educators across the country. It can be furthered by wide dissemination through training, workshops, and publications. The popularity of design as education in India is growing rapidly and thus intensifying this need.

CTL team had envisioned a five-year plan and budgeted activities along the three verticals of Reflect-Research, Explore-Grow and Connect-Outreach. This was proposed as part of a larger planned SFC proposal. Subsequently, CTL was encouraged to initiate certain low budget activities.

The CTL team had a strategic meeting in the month of April, to plan certain in-house activities (spread across the three NID campus) and some to pan across newly found NID.

Under the mandate of Explore-Grow, CTL proposes to hold lectures, workshops, and training for faculty colleagues in order to inform them vis-à-vis new research in the domain of design pedagogy, cognition, learnability and several others. So, one of the plans under the vertical of Explore-Grow was to hold a workshop among NID faculty (of all three campuses) in unconference mode. The team believes that preference should be given to the younger faculty to participate, share and discuss, and even raise questions rather than present and declare. The workshop is



tentatively scheduled for October/ November after the convocation.

The tentative topics proposed by the team were: Aligning with today's learners, Inclusive teaching in design, Design teaching and diverse learners-challenges and opportunities. The convenors for these could be young faculty colleagues from each campus.

Under the mandate of Connect-Outreach, CTL proposes to partner with internal departments within the three NID campuses, alternative education hubs & think tanks, with international MoU partners; to share, learn & contribute towards a robust "design learning and teaching culture". CTL facilitates formation of COPs- Communities of Practice, across the International MoU partners. CTL also envisions to initiate residency programs at NID by collaborating with National/ International MoU partners and Industry experts.

The CTL team also deliberated on the possibility of holding a two-day seminar (perhaps in unconference mode) on design education. The team considered various possibilities regarding the participants. The pros and cons of first holding it among the new four NIDs and thus keeping it at a national level, were weighed against making it an international event and inviting certain selected NID-MoU partners. Regarding the topic of the seminar, the following were shortlisted: Celebrating Design Educators, Design in Postcolonial Times, and Inclusive Design Teaching. Given the ebb and flow situation of the pandemic, the conference could be envisioned in a hybrid mode.

CTL felt that since the participants will be across the country and perhaps international as well, the seminar could be scheduled in the first half of 2023.



12. INTEGRATED DESIGN SERVICES (IDS)

Client servicing is an integral part of NID's activity. Through the Integrated Design Services (IDS), NID undertakes consultancy projects from various government, semi-government and private organizations and professionally deliver design solutions in diverse design domains ranging from Industrial Design, Communication Design, Textile/ Apparel/Lifestyle Accessory Design, and IT Integrated Design.

IDS also has its Outreach Activities to provide the Institute's experience and training facilities to the services of craft sectors in the areas of training, research and need assessment study, craft documentation, capacity building and skill upgradation in design using contextual approach.

Through its "Earn While You Learn" scheme, IDS also facilitates students in getting involved with real life projects, which in turn adds value to the upcoming professionals giving them a taste of actual situations.

18. OFFICIAL LANGUAGE IMPLEMENTATION

In order to ensure adequate propagation and development of the Official Language (OL) Hindi as per the Official Language Policy of the Government, the institute holds various activities/programmes in Hindi during 2019–2020 in the perspective of Annual Programme for 2019–2020 issued by the Department of Official Language. In order to comply with the instructions issued by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry regarding implementation/compliance of OL Policy of the Government and to achieve the target fixed by the Department of Official Language, with a renewed focus on the deliverables that must be sustained throughout the plan, not solely at its inception. The report also highlighted the importance of interdepartmental coordination in implementing an official languages plan.

The Official Languages Coordination Unit has been tasked with coordinating departmental action plans and with providing support needed by departments to identify and achieve the strategic. The institute has drawn its own action plan to implement various provisions contained therein. The OL Section mandate is therefore to ensure continued progress as the plan is rolled out and implemented in the coming years. Ministry-wise/Region-wise assessment of the use of Hindi, on basis of review of the compliance of the section 3(3) of the Official Languages Act, 1963 and rule 5 of the Official Languages Rules, 1976 relating to correspondence in Hindi, publication, code-manual and training etc. in Hindi, purchase of Hindi books in Central Government Offices, computerization and Hindi, compulsory provision of Hindi knowledge in recruitment rules, availability of Hindi medium in academic and training institutions, expenditure on Hindi advertisements and use of Hindi for commercial activities etc.

As a first step in this regard, most of the correspondences with Central and State Government organisations were made in Hindi. Apart from the day-to-day official works in Hindi, the following Hindi activities were organized in the institute with utmost motivation and encouragement.

• Celebration of Hindi Utsav-2021 With a view to create consciousness and accelerating the use of Hindi as an Official Language, a Hindi Utsav, was organized by this Department in September, 2021. Several competitions are organized every year during the Hindi Utsav in three campuses Ahmedabad,



Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru, were organized for the students, faculty members, and the employees. 

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN, AHMEDABAD ("the Institution"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2022 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) read with the National Institute of Design (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2016 and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Institute as at March 31, 2022 and its surplus for the year ended on that date.

- b. Balances of Rs. 363.53 lakhs under the head Projects receivables and service charges receivables are subject to confirmation and effect on these balances on account of adjustment, if any, required upon such confirmation are not determinable.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by the ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Institute in accordance with Code of Ethics issued by the ICAI. 

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad as on 31 March 2022 and the Income & Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 25(2) of the National Institute of Design (NID) Act, 2014. These financial statements are the responsibility of the NID's Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial statements with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

- Based on our audit, we report that:
- We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Government under sub-rule (1) of rule 4 of National Institute of Design (Form of Annual Accounts) Rules, 2016.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the NID as required under Section 25 (1) of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv. We further report that:

Comments on Accounts

A Income and Expenditure Account

A.1 Other Administrative Expenses: ₹19.99 Crore

This does not include ₹21.26 lakh towards annual lease rent liability payable to Sabarmati River Front Development Company Ltd. (SRFDCL) against the land in possession of NID.

The non-recognition of the annual lease rent payment of ₹10.63 lakh for the FY 2020-21 and 2021-22 has resulted in understatement of expenditure and overstatement of surplus income by ₹21.26 lakh for the two-year period 2020-21 and 2021-22.

A.2 Other Administrative Expenses: ₹19.99 crore

This does not include liability of ₹34.02 lakh towards unpaid Property Tax against two Properties of NID, Ahmedabad situated at Bengaluru campus.

Property tax, being a statutory payment of NID Bengaluru campus for the Research and Development Centre located at two places, one at Tumkur Road and another at Rajaji Nagar was pending since 2008-09 and 2011-12 respectively.

Non-recognition of the unpaid Property Tax against the demand of Bengaluru Municipal Corporation has resulted in understatement of expenditure and overstatement of Surplus Income by ₹34.02 lakh for the FY 2021-22.

B General

Current Liabilities (Schedule-5): ₹39.50 crore

During the FY 2021-22, NID provided a current liability of ₹3.73 crore towards Phase-I&II under Design Clinic Scheme of MSME against a demand of ₹8.58 crore raised by them.

The above has not been disclosed by NID in its books.

C. Grant-in-aid

Grants and Contributions (Schedule 3): ₹16.53 crore

NID had unspent balance of Plan Grant of ₹24.67 crore pertaining to previous years. During 2021-22, NID received a Plan Grant of ₹38.65 crore. An amount of ₹46.79 crore was utilised during the year 2021-22 leaving a balance of ₹16.53 crore unutilized as on 31 March 2022.

- Subject to our observation in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies

and Notes on Accounts, and subject to matters mentioned in the Annexure-I to this Separate Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India, except the following:

- a) in so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad as at 31 March 2022; and
- b) in so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, of the excess of income over expenditure for the year ended on that date.

NOTES FORMING PART OF ACCOUNTS

1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

a. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:

The Financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting except for interest income, fees and liability towards privileged leave.

b. INVESTMENTS:

Long Term Investments are stated at cost.

c. FIXED ASSETS:

Fixed Assets are stated at the cost. The cost includes invoice value, freight, octroi, and other incidental expenses relating acquisition.

d. GOVERNMENT GRANTS:

- i Government grants are accounted on the basis of sanction from Government Department.
- II Government grant to the extent utilized towards capital expenditure, are transferred to the Capital Fund.
- iii Government grants for meeting Revenue expenditure are treated as income of the year to the extent of expenditure incurred.
- iv Unutilized grants are carried forward and exhibited as a Liability in the Balance Sheet
- The excess recurring expenditure incurred against recurring grant is met from NID's own source of funds.

e. DEPRECIATION:

- ii. Depreciation on addition has been provided for the full year irrespective of date of acquisition.
- iii Capital Fund account has been transferred to Income and Expenditure account to the extent of depreciation provided on assets acquired out of capital grant.
- iv Depreciation is not provided on assets sold during the year.

f. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTION:

Transaction denominated in foreign currency are accounted for at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction. The bank balance held in foreign currency is converted in to Rupee at the rate prevailing on the closing day of the financial year.

g. CURRENT ASSETS, LOANS AND ADVANCES:

In the opinion of the Management, the current assets, loans and advances have a value on realisation in the ordinary course of business, equal at least to the aggregate amount shown in the Balance Sheet.

h. RETIREMENT/TERMINAL BENEFIT

Terminal leave encashment benefit to the employees is accounted for on cash basis. The institute has created Employee's Leave Encashment Earmarked Fund. The amount paid for leave encashment has been charged to the said fund.

Gratuity is charged to Income & Expenditure A/c on the basis of Actuarial valuation and the same is contributed to the NID Employees' Gratuity Fund.

i. UNCLAIMED STUDENT DEPOSIT

The unclaimed student deposit lying for more than 10 years amounting to Rs. 2,40,000/- has been credited to Donation for Financial Aid to Students.





ANNEXURE 1

National Design Business Incubator (NDBI)

NDBI is a design-centred technology business incubator of NID Ahmedabad set-up with support from the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India and Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce and Industry. NDBI is also one of the nodal institutes for the Industries Commissionerate, Government of Gujarat for promoting state start-up/innovation policies.

Highlights of the Key NDBI Initiatives/ Activities Accomplished During FY 2021-2022

Memorandum of Association signed with:

- NDBI signed an MoU with "Kauvery Hospital" for funding and research related support to its startups working in the healthcare sector.
- Partnered with "Arthayan" and "Due Dash" to aid NDBI incubated start-ups in raising fund for their venture.
- NDBI also tied-up with "Brand Compass" and "Advisory Monks" to support its start-ups in the area of digital marketing and Legal/Accounting services respectively.

Supported 14 student projects under Student Start-up & Innovation Policy (SSIP) of Government of Gujarat-Education Department; total grant money of INR 12.38 lakhs was disbursed to selected projects under the scheme.

Other Accomplishments:

- Conducted more than 20 Workshops & Webinars for Start-ups, students, and other ecosystem stakeholders. Most of the events were conducted online due to COVID-19.
- NDBI hosted final round of Street Vending Cart Design competition, where 15 teams across all NID's participated under 3 categories namely "Fruit/

Vegetable vending Cart", Food vending Cart", and General Merchandise.

• Approved seed fund of INR 62.0 lakhs to its 3 incubated start-ups for supporting them scale-up their ventures to the next stage.

Brief Introduction to Newly Incubated Start-ups: Navyoni Technologies Pvt. Ltd.

Navyoni Technologies has developed a smart basin cabinet called 'Castalia'. It offers touchless hand washing system through various sensors. The single unit is laden with various smart features which buyers can customise based on their requirements. With a luxurious feel to the washrooms, it also allows users to effectively monitor water consumption and thus can help in cutting down the water wastage. Moreover, these units are user-friendly for installation.

Ryot Agro Private Limited

An Agri-tech start-up from Kerala has done innovation in the agricultural machineries segment led by their "Automatic Cocoa Bean Separating Machine" that is used to break the cocoa pods and separate cocoa beans automatically. The primary focus of this start-up is to help farmers increase their productivity through mechanisation in agriculture.



ANNEXURE 2

India Design Council

The India Design Council is an autonomous body of the Government of India established under the aegis of Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion, Ministry of Commerce and Industry. It is a national strategic body for multidisciplinary design and is involved in design promotion and ultimately make India a designenabled country. In 2007, India became one of the few countries to adopt a National Design Policy. To enable the policy implementation, the Indian Government announced establishment of the Indian Design Council (IDC) in March 2009.

The India Design Council is spearheading the national design direction and is working with other government agencies, the design community, industrial establishments, and educational institutions to promote design in business, and society and public services so as to develop design excellence.

The India Design Mark is a design standard or a symbol which recognises good design. The India Design Council grants the India Design Mark after evaluating good design through a systemised process. India Design Mark is initiated in cooperation with the Good Design Award, Japan. The India Design Mark symbolises product excellence in form, function, quality, safety, sustainability, and innovation and communicates that the product is usable, durable, aesthetically appealing and incorporates the value of social responsibility.

The third council was formed on May 8, 2017, and it completed its three-year term on May 7, 2020. The reconstitution of the next Governing Council of the IDC by the Ministry is awaited.

Virtual Jury of I-Mark 2021: On August 28, 2021, the IDC organised the final 2nd stage jury of I-Mark 2021 being the 10th cycle of India Design Mark. This year again like I-Mark 2020, the offline Jury & Exhibition was called off due to the prevailing Covid19 pandemic and the Jury was ONLINE.

The Member Secretary chaired the Jury along with the team of 13 Jury members who conducted the Online Jury for 57 entries in presence of the applicants on zoom call. A virtual Award Ceremony was scheduled & organised on 30th October 2021 for the winners of the 10th cycle of India Design Mark 2021.

Good Design Seminar & India Design Mark Awards 2021

IDC in association with EEPC India organized a Good Design Seminar along with the India Design Mark Awards 2021 ceremony on October 30, 2021. The tenth cycle of India Design Mark was concluded, and 47 products were granted the prestigious India Design Mark. A 13-member Jury judged these products.

Hon. Shri Anurag Jain, the Secretary, DPIIT, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India was the Chief Guest of the event. The I-Mark 2022 was announced open by the Chief Guest while encouraging the manufacturing sectors, MSME and designers to apply their new offerings for I-Mark Awards.






